The Behavioral Health Division (BHD) Community Services Branch provides a full array of supportive community services for persons with severe and persistent mental illnesses and/or who have been affected by alcohol and other drug abuse .

Annually BHD Community Services Branch serves over 10,000 Milwaukee County residents through SAIL and Wiser Choice. These two programs work together to ensure residents between 18 and 59 years old receive trustworthy and reliable services for mental health and/or AODA needs.

SAIL

(Service Access to Independent Living)

SAIL is the central access point for Milwaukee County residents who have a severe and persistent mental illness and require long-term community support.

The SAIL unit assesses individual needs and facilitates access to community services and supports.

The community programs to which persons are referred include:

- ◇ Targeted Case Management
- ◇ Community Support Programs
- ◇ Day Treatment
- ◇ Group Home Placements

This program serves individuals and families whose lives have been affected by alcohol or other drug use. It also serves pregnant women of all ages in need of treatment and recovery services. Wiser Choice is designed to eliminate barriers to successful treatment and recovery.

Services provided include:

- ◇ Methadone Maintenance
- ◇ Detoxification
- ◇ Recovery Support Services
