

What is SAIL?

SAIL is the central access point for Milwaukee County residents requiring long term community support such as case management, day treatment, group home placements, and outpatient services.

What is needed to complete a SAIL referral?

Mental health providers should include the following information when making a referral to long-term support services:

- * A SAIL referral which can be obtain by downloading it at <http://county.milwaukee.gov/forms.htm> or calling 414.257.8095
- * Psychiatric / psychological evaluation completed within 1 year of the referral date
- * Updated / current social service data base or psychosocial assessment
- * Current hospitalization initial assessment, if applicable
- * Copies of hospital and treatment discharge summaries
- * Treatment Plan Review Summaries in the last year

To initiate a referral, the assigned mental health professional should complete and collect the above listed items and mail or fax them to SAIL.
