

## Voting Resources

**Wisconsin Government Accountability Board (GAB)** – <http://gab.wi.gov/elections-voting/photo-id>

This is your best and most up-to-date voting resource. The site includes all new rules on voter ID, absentee balloting, a link to the form that gets people a free Wisconsin ID, and more.
