Referral data above includes referrals from law enforcement for alleged Delinquency, referrals for Juveniles in Need of Protection or Services (JIPS), venue transfers, requests for courtesy supervision, and other types of miscellaneous arrests. The Department only accepts Delinquency and JIPS referrals for youth ages less than 17 years of age. Youth 17 years of age or older are referred to the adult criminal system. The data does not include referrals in which the only basis for referral is an outstanding warrant and referrals may include matters that are diverted from case filing or result in prosecution declined or dismissal.
