The project, to study the current and future needs of the Parkway from Congress Street to Church Street, held an initial public meeting last November to identify problems and hear feedback on suggested solutions. More than 200 people provided ideas that helped the design team develop the concepts that will be presented for review February 12.

The meeting will feature a PowerPoint presentation at 5:00 p.m., repeated at 6:15 p.m., highlighting improvements to segments of the Parkway developed to improve pedestrian access, bike and pedestrian safety, traffic flow, parkway aesthetics, and to apply best management practices to improve storm-water runoff quality and improve the environment. Representatives from Milwaukee County Parks and the engineering consulting team, GAI Consultants, Inc., will be available to receive feedback and answer questions.
