### **Man Narrowly Misses Hitting Deputy on Freeway, Arrested for OWI-4<sup>th</sup>**

Milwaukee, WI – A Milwaukee County Sheriff's deputy arrested Glenn J. Jach, age 44, at about 2:30 a.m. today for Operating While Intoxicated-4<sup>th</sup> offense.

The sheriff's deputy was getting back in his squad after a traffic stop on I-94 eastbound at 84<sup>th</sup> Street, when a car traveling at a high rate of speed came dangerously close to striking him. The deputy noted that there were no other vehicles in the other lanes that would have prevented the driver from moving over, as required by law. The deputy followed the driver and stopped him on I-94 near Hawley Road.

The deputy observed several signs of intoxication, including red, glassy eyes, slurred speech and the odor of alcohol on his breath, and conducted standardized field sobriety tests. Jach admitted to having only one drink. He failed the tests, registered a .14 on the PBT and was taken into custody. He was transported to the County Correctional Facility-Central where a legal blood draw was obtained.

Jach was issued citations for Operating While Intoxicated - 4<sup>th</sup> within 5 years, Prohibited Alcohol Concentration, and Failure to Change Lane-Passing Emergency Vehicle. His prior OWI offenses occurred in March 1989, October 2001 and December 2006.

If convicted of his fourth OWI offense, Jach faces a Class H Felony with up to 6-years imprisonment.

The move-over law requires drivers to shift lanes, or slow down if traffic prohibits moving over, to help safeguard law enforcement officers, emergency responders, and road maintenance workers performing their responsibilities on the freeways.
