Operation Drive Sober Results in 18 Drunken Driver Arrests 863 repeat offenders since January 2010

Milwaukee, WI – At the start of this year, Sheriff David A. Clarke Jr. ordered an aggressive weekend Driving Under the Influence (DUI) initiative to rid the Milwaukee County freeway system of drunken drivers.

This weekend's initiative from Friday at 6:00 p.m. through Sunday at 6:00 a.m. resulted in the arrest of 18 drunken drivers. Three of these were repeat offenders, one underage drinker, and one of the DUI-1st offenders fled the scene on foot and robbed a man before he was captured.

On Saturday, at 2:25 a.m., a deputy stopped a vehicle on N. 6th Street south of Michigan Avenue for lane deviation. The driver, Michael Leflore, age 33, of Milwaukee, fled on foot after failing field sobriety tests. MCSO and MPD squads responded to search for him. The passenger, Michael Quezaire, age 24, of Milwaukee was in possession of a firearm, tested .09 on a PBT, and was taken into custody for Endangering Safety by Use of a Dangerous Weapon.

At 2:45 a.m., a 911 caller reported that he had been robbed and pushed down near the Ramada Inn, and followed the subject to the Milwaukee Public Museum area. Deputies found and arrested Leflore in the MacArthur Square parking structure. MCSO will seek charges of DUI-1st, Robbery with Use of Force, and Resisting/Obstructing against Leflore. If convicted of these charges, Leflore faces up to 15 years, 9 months in prison. Quezaire faces up to 9 months in jail.

Repeat DUI offenders included Robert Kammermann, age 54, of Waterloo; David Gilleski, age 25, of Kewaskum; and Jorge Rubio, age 26, of West Allis.

First offenders included Milwaukee residents Juan Rosado, age 34, Tyrone Nichols, age 43, Neal Goad, age 55, Tommie King, age 28, Artavia McIntosh, age 27, Amanda Wallich, age 27, Amanda Koschmann, age 27, Robert McKnight, age 32, and Daniel Molina, age 21. Other first offenders were: Nathaniel Keaton, age 19, of Parma, Ohio, Luis Guerrero-Montes, age 24, of Waukesha, Robin Hall, age 30, of Oak Creek, and Craig Swiontek, age 40 and John Mullarkey, age 25, both of Wauwatosa.

Representative Jim Ott and Senator Alberta Darling have co-sponsored a bill in the Wisconsin Legislature to make it even tougher for drunken drivers to escape the consequences of their actions. The bill will prevent judges from finding loopholes to avoid handing out stiffer sentences.

Deputies will STOP, TEST, and ARREST everyone suspected of impaired driving.
