Operation Drive Sober Results in 11 Drunken Driver Arrests 919 Repeat Offenders Since January 2010

Milwaukee, WI – At the start of this year, Sheriff David A. Clarke Jr. ordered an aggressive weekend Driving Under the Influence (DUI) initiative to rid the Milwaukee County freeway system of drunken drivers.

This weekend's initiative from Friday at 6:00 p.m. through Sunday at 6:00 a.m. resulted in the arrest of 11 drunken drivers. The average PAC of these offenders was .13.

Repeat offenders arrested for their second offense were John Gaynor, age 22, and Latonia Coney, age 45, both of Milwaukee.

Victor Huesca-Jimenez, age 23, of Milwaukee, was arrested for his first offense, and also will be charged with DUI with minor children under 16 years of age in the vehicle.

Other first-time offenders included Milwaukee residents: Elizabeth Roubik, age 39; Fortino Perez-Hernandez, age 36; Brian Novena, age 34, a Homeland Security Agent; and Todd Wisniewski, age 44. Also arrested for DUI-1st include Stephanie Kessler, age 23, of Cudahy; Christopher Kitz, age 23, of Hartland, who was involved in a one-car crash; Kyle Kitzrow, age 23, of Oak Creek; and Ralph Malec, age 41, of Kenosha.
