### **Operation Drive Sober Results in 13 Arrests DUI-2<sup>nd</sup> in Rollover Crash, Good Sam's Car Stolen at Scene 1078 Repeat Offenders Since January 2010**

**Milwaukee, WI – At the start of last year, Sheriff David A. Clarke Jr. ordered an aggressive weekend Driving Under the Influence (DUI) initiative to rid the Milwaukee County freeway system of drunken drivers.**

**This weekend's initiative from Friday at 4:00 p.m. through Sunday at 6:00 a.m. resulted in the arrest of 13 drunken drivers, one involved in a rollover crash. The average PBT result was .13.**

**Three repeat offenders were arrested for DUI-2<sup>nd</sup>: Bennie Alonzo Teague, age 37, of Milwaukee; Anthony Lemieux, age 35, of Glendale; and Ilija Stanic, age 34, of Franklin. Teague was involved in a rollover crash, landing on its roof, on Saturday at 2:45 p.m. on 145 southbound near Grantosa. A good Samaritan stopped and called 911, and said the occupant was no longer in the car. While on the phone with dispatch, he saw that his car had been stolen.**

**Teague returned to the scene driving another vehicle, along with his brother, and said his brother had crashed his car. The brother eventually admitted this was not the case, and Teague will receive two OWI citations for driving the crashed vehicle, and then returning in another vehicle with a .15 PBT. He was convicted for DUI-1<sup>st</sup> in April 2013. He faces up to six months in jail if convicted of the DUI-2<sup>nd</sup>. If convicted on both counts, the maximum penalty for the DUI-3<sup>rd</sup> offense is one year in jail.**

**Sheriff's detectives are investigating the theft of the good Samaritan's vehicle.**

**First time offenders cited from Milwaukee included: Tadeo Chiquito, age 25; Antonio Fumbanks, age 30; Scott Brunn, age 24; David Florentino, age 24, who was stopped going more than 100 mph; and Sierra Lockett, age 24. Also cited for DUI-1<sup>st</sup> offense were Gregory Jones II, age 32, of Shorewood; Andrew Jablonski, age 24, of West Allis; Parker Allen, age 27, of Glendale; and Wauwatosa residents Shane O'Hagan, age 37; and Shane Niffenegger, age 28.**
