Deputies Arrest 11 in Weekend Operation Drive Sober Initiative Two DUI-5th, One DUI-4th 1546 Repeat Offenders Since January 2010

Milwaukee, WI – Sheriff David A. Clarke Jr. has ordered a continued aggressive weekend Driving Under the Influence (DUI) initiative to rid the Milwaukee County freeway system of drunken drivers. This weekend's Operation Drive Sober initiative, from Friday at 4:00 p.m. through Sunday at 6:00 a.m., resulted in the arrest of eleven drunken drivers. The average PBT result was .13.

Four repeat offenders were arrested during the initiative. Elliott Glapa, age 33, of Milwaukee; and Ljuenne Short, age 37, of Zion, Illinois, were both arrested for felony DUI-5th offense. Kathleen Malison, age 59, was arrested the day before her 60th birthday for DUI-4th offense. Neset Skenadore, age 26, of Green Bay, was arrested for DUI-2nd offense.

First-time offenders taken into custody were: Gerald Fisher, age 25, of Wauwatosa, on the day before his 26th birthday; Sheldon Brown, age 35, of La Vista, Nebraska; Christopher Malnory, age 23, of Wind Lake; Mary Keegan, age 66, of Grafton; Yvette James, age 50, of South Milwaukee; Lindsay Day, age 24, of Sussex; and Armani Henderson, age 20, of Milwaukee.

Saturday, June 4, at about 1:00 a.m., a deputy stopped a Chrysler minivan driving the wrong way on a city street at 7th St. and W. Cleveland Avenue. Elliott Glapa, age 33, of Milwaukee, was arrested for DUI-5th. His previous convictions were April 2004, June 2005, August 2007, and June 2009. Glapa refused to say where he had been drinking, but said he had four vodka drinks. If convicted, he faces up to six years in prison.

Also on Saturday, June 4, at about 2:15 a.m., a deputy stopped a vehicle that was deviated from its lane on I-43 southbound at S. 124th Street. The driver, Ljuenne Short, age 37, of Zion, Illinois, whose license was revoked, refused to submit to a PBT. Short was arrested for DUI-5th offense. His prior convictions were in April, 2002, June 5, 2003, June 13, 2003 and November 2009. He said he had one shot and one beer at his home before driving to Wisconsin. Short faces up to six years in prison if convicted.
