Deputies Arrest 15 in Weekend Operation Drive Sober Initiative Eight repeat offenders, one DUI-6th 1553 Repeat Offenders Since January 2010

Milwaukee, WI – Sheriff David A. Clarke Jr. has ordered a continued aggressive weekend Driving Under the Influence (DUI) initiative to rid the Milwaukee County freeway system of drunken drivers. This weekend's Operation Drive Sober initiative, from Friday at 4:00 p.m. through Sunday at 6:00 a.m., resulted in the arrest of fifteen drunken drivers. The average PBT result was .16.

Repeat offenders arrested were Randi Oesterle, age 41, of Germantown, for DUI-6th offense; Brenda Lawrence, age 46, of Waukesha, for DUI-4th; James Stewart, age 45, of Milwaukee, for DUI-3rd; and DUI-2nd offense arrests for George Schley, age 22, of Shorewood; Cody Schleichert, age 29, of North Prairie; Amrit Lal, age 29, of Brookfield; and Milwaukee residents Samuel Limon, age 28; and Michael Malone, age 37.

First-time offenders taken into custody were Timothy Fuchs, age 40, of Friendship , WI; Bobby Allen, age 33, of West Bend; Jose Aguilera, age 25, of Greenfield; Victor Ramirez, age 51,of West Allis; and Milwaukee residents: Sarah Stinson, age 29; Jose Guerera-Silva, age 23; and Cainion Zaneta, age 31.

DUI-6th Offense

Randi Lyn Oesterle, age 41, of Germantown, was arrested for DUI-6th offense, and also charged with DUI- minor child in vehicle at 7:15 p.m. on Saturday. A deputy observed a red Cadillac deviating lanes northbound US-45 near Capitol Drive, and stopped the vehicle at Good Hope Road.

The driver said she had six beers at the Brewers game, and refused the breathalyzer test. A search warrant was obtained for a blood draw at Froedtert Hospital. Oesterle's previous DUI convictions were in June 2003, January 2004, August 2005, May 2008, and November 2009. For the Class H felony DUI-6th offense charge, Oesterle faces up to 12 years in prison. This penalty can be doubled if she is also convicted of the DUI/Minor child in vehicle charge.
