Parks Director Sue Black & I received numerous toys and other educational supplies on behalf of the Martin Luther King, Jr., Community Center Tuesday afternoon. Dozens of items, including board games, basketballs and educational card games, were donated for use in the King Center's children's area by the #1Stunnas Motorsports Organization – Milwaukee Chapter.

The #1 Stunnas presented the items in memory of four Milwaukee children who are no longer with us. Quadrevion Henning and Purvis Parker drowned in the McGovern Park lagoon in March 2006. Jasmine Owens was just 4 years old when she was shot and killed, the unintended victim of a drive-by shooting in May of last year. Alexis Patterson has been missing since 2002 when she was 7 years old.

“We're pleased to receive the gifts to support the great children's programs at the King Center, Supervisor Elizabeth Coggs said.

“Children are this community's future, and these gifts will give our kids additional ways to learn and grow.” Dee (MamaRaisin) McCollum, Vice-President of the #1 Stunnas added,
