LIVING WAGE ORDINANCE PASSES

Supervisor Bowen authored and successfully passed a living wage ordinance in Milwaukee County. This ordinance ensures a living wage of \$11.33 – 100 percent of the poverty level for a family of four - for employees of contractors who do business with the County.

Through Supervisor Bowen's leadership, Milwaukee County joined more than 140 municipalities all over the Country who have made it a priority to **invest in a thriving local economy** by raising the wages of some of the County's lowest paid workers.

Unfortunately, the **County Executive Abele opposed this measure**, but a two-thirds Board majority proceeded with action to address the critical issues of income inequality and poverty.

The Ready to Work initiative seeks to match ready to work individuals with jobs training and placement in the manufacturing and construction industries. To date 500 people have been successfully placed in jobs with an average hourly wage of \$19.00.

Bowen Budget Actions



2014 Budget actions either sponsored, co-sponsored or supported by Supervisor Bowen:

- Restored over \$35,000 in funding to the Election Commission so they may place ads in community newspapers that reach under-served communities in the County
- Allocated \$50,000 to expand UW-Extension's Pre-college 4-H STEM Program to middle school students on Milwaukee's North Side
- Re-started a micro loan fund for small and disadvantaged businesses
- Invested \$2 million to keep Pulaski and Noyes pools open and operating
- Restored some cuts to the Sheriff's office and addressed high crime areas by allocating \$175,000 for the ShotSpotter system, which identifies the location of gun crimes
- Passed budget with no tax levy increase

2014 Parks Projects



Moody Park

22nd St. & Burleigh St.

- Full park revitalization, including new community building, splash pad, basketball courts, football/soccer field, community garden plots, walking paths, lighting, and open-air pavilion/theater

Johnsons Park

17th St. & Fond Du Lac Ave.

- A new open-air pavilion with restrooms will be constructed as part of a full revitalization plan with support from the Rotary Club. An amphitheater named in honor of John Walker will also be added to the Park

Tiefenthaler Park (27th & Cherry) & Lindbergh Park (16th & Nash)

- Plans are in the works to resurface the playground area at both parks. The new surfacing would replace the current sand, which can conceal garbage and hazardous objects

King Park

17th St. & Vliet St.

- A King Park Walkway Project is being planned to re-establish the Park's outdoor skating rink
