David's Desk: Milwaukee County's Fiscal Situation

As we head into budget season, I thought this might be a good opportunity to share with my fellow residents of the 8th District the state of Milwaukee County's budget. After speaking with our knowledgeable Comptroller's office, I was informed that our current debt is approximately **\$680 million**, and our debt service for 2016 is **\$89.7 million**, which is down a little from \$90.2 million in 2015. The interest portion of those debt service payments is \$26.4 million in 2016.

Each year, the County Executive submits a requested budget to the Board, although the final version is ultimately put together and approved by the Board. You can find the entirety of County Executive Abele's 2017 Requested Budget [here](#). He is also seeking public input through an online survey. According to the survey, "While Milwaukee County has made progress on improving its fiscal health, the upcoming 2017 budget still has a \$66 million budget gap, and a long list of infrastructure needs. The County Executive does not want to cut services to fill this gap, and is considering new revenue options." 



FALL CLEANUP BEGINS TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 15, 2016

The Street Department will conduct its fall clean up beginning Tuesday, November 15, 2016, for residential homes or condos that have City provided garbage and recycling pick up. There is no charge for this pick up. Items that WILL be picked up are as follows:

- Garden Clippings (excluding leaves, grass and branches)
- Furniture • Wood
- Appliances (doors need to be removed from refrigerators and freezers)
- Construction Materials (not resulting from a contractor)
- Metal • Mattresses • Televisions • Carpeting/Rugs
- Items that WILL NOT be picked up are as follows:
 - Paints • Tires • Batteries • Hazardous Materials • Leaves
 - Branches • Fluorescent Tubes • Concrete/Stone/Dirt
 - Grass Clippings
- Residents are required to have their items at the curb or roadside by 6:45 a.m. on Tuesday, November 15 in order to be guaranteed a pick up. Once we pass through your neighborhood, we will not return for additional no charge pick ups until the spring clean-up, Monday, May 15, 2017.


Fitness

Vetter Denk Plans Mixed Use Project for Downtown South Milwaukee

Microbrewery Anchors Development with Residential, Retail, Public Space

SOUTH MILWAUKEE – Award-winning architecture and development firm Vetter Denk has proposed a mixed-used development for downtown South Milwaukee anchored by a new microbrewery.

Plans include 24 market-rate apartments, additional retail/restaurant space and an outdoor courtyard that would host events throughout the year, including weekly entertainment offered as part of the adjacent South Milwaukee Downtown Market.

The South Milwaukee Plan Commission heard about the project concept at its meeting on Aug. 22. Vetter Denk plans to return to the Plan Commission at its Sept. 26 meeting, seeking approval on an option to purchase the 0.74-acre, city-owned property at 11th and Madison Avenues.

“This project would be a game-changer for downtown South Milwaukee,” Mayor Erik Brooks said. “It is one of the biggest developments in our city center in decades, and it will serve as a catalyst in our ongoing downtown redevelopment efforts.

“It’s especially exciting to have a first-class firm like Vetter Denk behind this. From the Beerline riverfront condominiums in Milwaukee to their work in redeveloping Green Bay’s waterfront, Vetter Denk’s track record is second to none. They will raise the bar for development, redevelopment, and design across our city.”

Said Vetter Denk co-owner John Vetter: “We are very excited to lead the way in South Milwaukee with a project that conforms to the unique opportunities of South Milwaukee. The recently completed comprehensive plan shows a deep commitment by the city administration and residents to rethink the city for a new age – and this project will serve as a testament to that collective desire.”

The estimated \$6.6 million project calls for the following:

- An approximately 5,000-square foot microbrewery with adjacent beer garden;
- 24 one-, two- and three-bedroom apartments;
- A 8,000-square-foot green space that will serve as a public square and gathering place for the apartment dwellers, nearby business patrons and community members; and
- Approximately 5,000 square feet of retail or restaurant space.

The brewery and retail users have not yet been finalized, but there has been strong interest in both spaces so far. Work on securing those businesses will pick up as Vetter Denk finalizes its plans, obtains additional city approvals and seeks to begin construction in the spring of 2017.

The proposed development site is a combination of five parcels the city purchased in 2008 and is located in one of South Milwaukee's four tax increment financing (TIF) districts. Vetter Denk is expected to seek city TIF funding for the project, though the amount is still being finalized.

The development is the latest example of South Milwaukee's downtown rebirth. The city council recently passed its long-range downtown plan and an expanded grant program for new and expanding downtown business. New streetscaping for Milwaukee Avenue is planned for the spring of 2017, and the city is studying the creation of a downtown business improvement district or a similar organization, as well as membership in the Main Street program.

"This project will be a huge lift for our continued work in our city center," Brooks said. "It shows that our hard work to redefine what South Milwaukee can be is paying off, and this is just the beginning."

The market, founded in 2009, operates every Thursday during the summer and early fall on 11th Avenue between Milwaukee and Madison Avenues, featuring more than 50 vendors selling produce, prepared foods, baked goods, arts and crafts. "The South Milwaukee Downtown Market was a key factor in choosing this downtown site," Vetter said.

Said Downtown Market Board Chairwoman Carol Rehak: "The market feels this is a creative use of these land parcels. We are very pleased that the developers are incorporating the South Milwaukee Downtown Market into the design."



- Photo ID (recommended; mandatory for 1st time and **NEW** to Milwaukee County applicants)
- Social Security Numbers and dates of birth for everyone in the household
- Current gas, electric or oil energy bill (or a lease / letter from your landlord if your heat is included in your rent)
- Proof of all income sources for the entire household's gross income for the 3 months prior to application (child support, wages, pension, unemployment, etc.) Seasonal employees will require the prior year's entire tax package
