Mitchell Park Domes Placed on List of “11 Most Endangered” Historic Sites in the United States



On Wednesday, October 5, Milwaukee County Supervisor Jason Haas, Chair of the Parks Committee, joined with staff from the National Trust for Historic Preservation and the Milwaukee Preservation Alliance to announce that the Mitchell Park Domes have been placed on the 2016 *America's 11 Most Endangered Places* list.

A national staff member from the National Trust for Historic Preservation has traveled to Milwaukee's Mitchell Park Domes for the announcement with Supervisor Haas.

The annual *America's 11 Most Endangered Places* list has identified historic and important places across America that are threatened by neglect, insufficient funds, inappropriate development or insensitive public policy.

In a statement, the National Trust said, “A beloved Milwaukee institution for generations, a unique engineering marvel and a highly significant example of midcentury modern architecture, the Milwaukee Domes are facing calls for their demolition.”

Only two other Wisconsin sites have previously made the annual *America's 11 Most Endangered Places* list: Frank Lloyd Wright's Taliesin, in Spring Green, and the National Soldiers Home Historic District, in Milwaukee.



County Supervisors: Living Wage Needed

Today, a low-wage worker's movement is calling for living wages to transform the employment of today into good jobs.

Milwaukee needs good jobs and economic justice. Our community faces a crisis of inequality and poverty driven by the absence of family-supporting employment once abundant in Milwaukee. For decades, inflation-adjusted wages and living standards have stagnated while declining for low-income workers, causing poverty and inequality to skyrocket.

Living wage jobs in factories disappeared, replaced by an explosion of low-wage service-sector employment. Nearly half of all jobs and seven of the 10 fastest-growing occupations pay less than \$15 per hour. The working people of Milwaukee once employed as autoworkers, steelworkers and machinists now find employment as food service workers, hotel housekeepers, home health aides, janitors and retail workers.

Addressing our crisis means transforming these jobs that exist into good jobs paying living wages.

Lawmakers have not crafted policies for 21st-century labor markets. Minimum wage stuck at \$7.25 per hour has not kept pace with productivity gains. Had lawmakers adjusted minimum wage accordingly, it would be roughly \$20 per hour.

Today, a low-wage worker's movement is calling for living wages to transform the employment of today into good jobs. The movement has won victories such as \$15 minimum wage laws, most visibly in Seattle, California and New York. Here in Wisconsin, recent polling found that 63% of voters support a \$15 minimum wage.

This "fight for \$15" movement has begun winning here. Last month, Dane County amended its "living wage" ordinance to raise the wage floor to \$15 per hour, too. This past summer, the Milwaukee Bucks and the Alliance for Good Jobs announced a community benefits agreement including a \$15 wage floor and protection of workers' rights.

We are bringing the "fight for \$15" to Milwaukee County. Last week, we introduced legislation to raise the county's "living wage" ordinance to \$15 per hour by 2022, thereafter increasing with the cost of living. County Executive Chris Abele proposed a similar measure in his budget. If adopted, these proposals would ensure that fair pay rewards hard work for the employees of county contractors and of businesses benefiting from the use of county funds and resources.

Raising Milwaukee County's living wage to \$15 per hour alone will not fix our crisis of inequality and poverty. But it will boost the paychecks of thousands of working people. It will establish a community standard for otherwise low-wage service-sector employment that characterizes the working lives of so many in Milwaukee. Imagine the impact on children in Milwaukee Public Schools when their parents bring home a paycheck providing a decent living standard, able to support student achievement.

We walk in the footsteps of those who have gone before us; by heeding the calls of a worker's movement for economic justice, just as lawmakers did last century, we can rebuild a shared prosperity economy that strengthens economic opportunity and security for all working people.
