New Dog Exercise Area

Work on a new dog park in Bay View is underway! The Chairwoman attended the groundbreaking of the new park on July 23.

This new exercise space will be located in the area north of Lincoln Avenue, east of Lenox Street, and east of South Bay Street in Bay View.

In January, Milwaukee Alderman Tony Zielinski presented a proposal to create the new dog park in our district. This new space will be a collaboration with the City of Milwaukee and Milwaukee County.

Some information about this special collaboration:

- The space will be fenced in
- The City of Milwaukee will be responsible for all maintenance (turf, seeding, plowing, clean-up etc.)
- Milwaukee County will handle permits for the park, and collect all permit revenues
- Milwaukee County Park Rangers will patrol the park

The Chairwoman was joined at the groundbreaking by Milwaukee County Executive Chris Abele, Milwaukee Mayor Tom Barrett and Alderman Zielinski, as well as several neighbors and their four-legged friends.

MPM Solar Panels

Contractors on Monday began a project to install solar panels to replace the marble exterior on the Milwaukee Public Museum's eight-story tower facing Wells Street.

When complete in about five months, it will be the only full solar wall in the city of Milwaukee. The museum's current marble wall panels are deteriorating. Milwaukee County, which owns the building, considered options including facade panels appearing similar to the existing marble, and glass, before opting for the solar panels.

The 234 panels will generate 77,533 kilowatt hours of electricity per year, enough to power 442 60-watt light bulbs eight hours a day for a full year. Helios USA, based in Milwaukee's Menomonee Valley, will manufacture the solar panels.

It will take about four weeks to remove the current marble panels. During that time, the museum's Puelicher Butterfly Vivarium and Bugs Alive! will be closed.

War Memorial—Art Museum Agreement

The Milwaukee County Board passed two measures Thursday July 25 that will move Milwaukee County forward and provide long-term sustainability for important public institutions. The Board approved a measure that will strengthen the financial viability of the Milwaukee Public Museum.

On a united vote of 18-0, the Board also approved a historic agreement between the War Memorial and the Milwaukee Art Museum that will help ensure the vitality of the buildings, grounds and properties of both organizations. Given this strong support, Board Chairwoman Marina Dimitrijevic called on the County Executive to sign the resolution immediately.

“Today’s unanimous vote on the War Memorial/Art Museum agreement by the Board shows leadership and reflects the values of Milwaukee County,” said Dimitrijevic after the vote. “Our united actions in support of veterans and the art museum will provide a long-term investment in our community. With this investment, we honor our veterans and their service to our country. The actions of the Board will provide value for generations to come.”

Under the compromise agreement, the War Memorial Center/Milwaukee Art Museum will receive \$1,586,000 per year from the County from 2014 through 2023. This includes a payment of \$1,100,000 to the Art Museum and \$486,000 to the War Memorial. The annual funding commitment ends after the ten-year period, but the other portions of the agreement could extend for up to 84 years.

County capital improvement funding of \$10 million **between 2013 and 2017 will supplement the Art Museum’s** planned private funding of \$15 million for a total \$25 million investment in improvements to the publicly owned portions of the War Memorial and Art Museum buildings and grounds, as well as the construction of a new east atrium.

“This investment in our cultural institutions is a win-win-win for the Milwaukee Art Museum, the War Memorial and the taxpayers of Milwaukee County, especially our veterans,” Dimitrijevic said.

Bay View bus stop project seen as monument, art and catalyst

Supporters of a solar-powered monument and bus shelter planned for Bay View in Milwaukee see it as a symbol of many things, including city-county partnership, the generosity of a donor and the reinvestment in the historic neighborhood.

See the Aug. 9 issue of The Business Journal for insight on the project from designer Roman Montoto, associate professor of architecture at the University of Idaho.

The Bay View Art Stop is designed to catch the eye. Solar panels on modern sweeping steel trusses will power LED lights, and large concrete foundations will bear the name of Bay View. It will stand in a triangle-shaped plaza bordered by Kinnickinnic, South Howell and East Lincoln avenues.

“It’s going to enhance the stature of the neighborhood,” said Bay View building and business owner Ken Yandell.

“It’s going to indicate that people are making investments here.”

The project is out for construction bids now, and is to be complete by the end of the year, said Yandell. Yandell, a board member of the Kinnickinnic Avenue Business Improvement District, owns buildings on Kinnickinnic immediately north of the bus stop site and the Studio Lounge.

The largest investment, \$150,000, comes from the trust of deceased, 30-year Milwaukee Department of Public Works employee David John Dombrowski. **A plaque on the site will commemorate Dombrowski’s donation, said** Ald. Tony Zielinski.

“I did not see anything in New York, Chicago, Los Angeles that even comes close to this,” he said.

The remaining \$50,000 for the project comes from Milwaukee County, Zielinski said. The county will own the structure once it is completed, and the Kinnickinnic Avenue BID will pay for its upkeep.

“It’s on city land and it’s a county bus shelter, so it’s a joint venture,” Zielinski said.

Rain barrels help keep excess water out of the sewer system when it rains. They also help prevent rain from becoming polluted stormwater runoff, the biggest remaining threat to clean water in the United States.

Emergency Home Repair

Loans are made to restore basic functions to home including: water, hot water, heat and municipal order compliance.

Standard Loan Programs

Cover a wide range of repairs including: roofing, siding, trim, windows, porches, foundation repair, heating, plumbing, electrical or other necessary repairs.

Income limits based on household size.

- Staff provides: Lead Risk Assessments, Detailed Scope of work and Bid out work to be done
- Homeowners receive a loan and sign contracts with approved contractors


