SUPERVISOR DIMITRIJEVIC NAMED ELEANOR ROOSEVELT HONOREE

Designation recognizes women who have made outstanding contributions as elected officials

Milwaukee, WI – Milwaukee County Supervisor Marina Dimitrijevic, who represents Milwaukee's near South Side and Bay View neighborhoods, will be recognized as part of the upcoming Eleanor Roosevelt Tribute from the Democratic Party of Wisconsin. Supervisor Dimitrijevic is being honored in the category of "Local Elected Leader," which recognizes women for leadership and activism to improve the lives of their constituents in every way possible, while being especially mindful of the issues that impact women the most.

"I am honored and humbled to receive such a prestigious award in remembrance of one of the most memorable women in United States history," Supervisor Dimitrijevic said.
