## O'Donnell Park & Garage: Should the County Sell?

The timeliest topic before Milwaukee County is the sale of O'Donnell Park and garage. Last year, the County Executive put the sale of O'Donnell in the 2014 Budget. Under my leadership, the Finance, Personnel and Audit Committee removed the item from the Budget and directed the Economic and Community Development (ECD) Director to prepare several reports. This month the sale of O'Donnell, as an informational item, (*i.e., no action resolution*), came before the ECD Committee, which I chair, and the Parks, Energy and Environment Committee, chaired by Supervisor Gerry Broderick. Our ECD committee received this informational report and referred it to Scott Manske, the county Comptroller, for proper vetting. The Comptroller's findings are to be reported in September again before the ECD committee. Meanwhile, a number of "Friends" groups are already weighing in on the wisdom of such a sale. I believe "taking sides" is unwise before proper vetting and the full information is before the elected representatives.

My own view:

Premise No. 1: Milwaukee County does not sell Park Land. (*Constituents will recall that I chose to run for office when my opponent promised to guarantee the veto power of then-County Executive Scott Walker proposed the sale of park land that included Warnimont Park. If you know anything about me, you know I am strongly motivated to protect our Parks and Lake Michigan even to the point of running for elected office*). Based on this first premise, the public park at the top of O'Donnell must continue to be public land subject to the oversight and review of county elected officials.

Premise No. 2: Milwaukee County has not done a particularly good job of running the public parking structure. The reports that the ECD committee received easily support this proposition. The county has had a long history of difficulties with this structure. Northwestern Mutual (NM), perhaps Milwaukee's finest corporate citizen and a cornerstone of downtown development, has the reputation and finances to improve

management of not only the parking lot but also the tenants within the structure.

With Premise No. 1 and Premise No. 2 in mind, there are many items that need to be reviewed, including purchase price, access for public parking and replacement parking at the end of useful life, among many others. All of these questions must be reviewed. But before any serious discussions take place, it will be incumbent upon the county to determine if NM is willing to agree that Milwaukee County does not sell Park Land, thus preserving the top plaza and lake-view vista. Once this is established, there are many legal structures that can formalize the retention of the public plaza/park while selling the under surface structure. As always, stay tuned.

# GMIA Airfield Update Newsletter

## July 20

Greetings!

Thank you for your interest in the latest edition of the General Mitchell International Airport (GMIA) Airfield Update. As summer progresses, even with the rain, projects that affect airport operations are moving along. There are several that are well underway, and others that are about to start.

Runway 1L/19R (main north/south runway) will remain closed for another couple of weeks. The shoulder work and concrete panel replacement on taxiways parallel to the runway are anticipated to be completed on August 4th. Later in August there will be daily closures associated with replacement of runway guard lights that warn taxiing pilots that they are about to cross a runway.

Runway 7R/25L (main east/west runway) will also experience daily closures with the resumption of bridge work over Howell Ave. that was begun last year. Construction is slated to begin shortly after the August 4th opening of Rwy 1L/19R, leading to a total of about two months of daily runway closures. Work will be coordinated with Rwy 1L/19R, as both will not be closed simultaneously during the overlap in projects. When completed, the bridge will be part of a new airport perimeter road that will increase safety by allowing airport vehicles to traverse the airport without having to cross an active runway.

The planned closure of the Ground Run-up Enclosure (GRE) began on, July 21st, with reopening slated for the week of August 4th. This represents the first significant maintenance on the facility since opening in 2002. Concrete panels that have deteriorated will be replaced along with general maintenance and upkeep items that are in need of attention. Since the GRE will be unusable, it should be anticipated that there may be increased noise from aircraft conducting engine maintenance test runs.

One of the smaller general aviation runways continues to be closed. Runway 7L/25R is unavailable in coordination with other projects and is also having its asphalt surface replaced. The asphalt project has received initial grant funding, with more anticipated shortly. Based on funding, the runway resurfacing will likely be completed at the beginning of September. Because of the smaller aircraft that use this runway, the impact to the surrounding communities should be minimal.

Lastly, while normally outside the scope of this newsletter, there is the baggage claim project and its effect on vehicle traffic at the airport. All vehicles, except shuttles, buses, and oversize vehicles, are being directed to the normal ticketing/check-in drive. Baggage claim is to the left as you enter and passenger drop-offs are to the right. Please be advised that the ticketing/check-in drive is height limited. Vehicle heights above 11'10" will not clear the overhead walkway structures. Heed any warnings that are activated if your vehicle is too high.

Thank you for your interest in the activities of GMIA. Any modifications to the above projects will be passed on through this newsletter, so please continue to monitor it over the coming months.


