## O'Donnell Park Hearing, 9/10/2014

Northwestern Mutual has proposed purchasing the O'Donnell Park and Garage owned by the county. As indicated in last month's newsletter, a public hearing was held by the joint committees of Economic and Community Development and Parks and Culture on September 10, 2014.

The turnout for this meeting was more than 300 people. Comment cards for speakers were required in order to obtain some information for the board. Of the 300, eighty actually made comments, with 39 supporting a sale, 39 against and two neutral. The hearing lasted about three hours. This public hearing was in addition to full committee hearings during our regular committee cycle by both committees. In other words, three public hearings were held regarding this very public debate. I believe the board has copiously provided due process for this debate. In addition, a Parks Advisory Committee, chaired by Cherie Briscoe and Lake Development Advisory Committee chaired by William Lynch, are expected to hold additional sessions.

There are clearly strong opinions on each side of this issue. The month of September provided only informational hearings and details of the proposed offer by Northwestern Mutual. In October, the board is expected to receive the actual offer with a Resolution for decision making purposes. I will continue to be interested in your



opinion on this so please add your voice even if you did not attend any of the committee hearings or attend the September 10<sup>th</sup> public hearing.

The Milwaukee County Board will hold its annual public hearing for the 2015 County Budget at 6:30 p.m. on November 3 in Windhover Hall at the Milwaukee Art Museum, 700 N. Art Museum Dr., Board Chairwoman Marina Dimitrijevic announced today.

“A budget is all about what priorities we have as a County, and the annual public hearing gives us a chance to hear directly from Milwaukee County residents about their own vision for this community,” Dimitrijevic said. “We are excited to hold this year’s hearing at the Milwaukee Art Museum at a time when our community is engaged in a conversation about cultural assets and the lakefront.”

Dimitrijevic said the budget hearing is one of most important meetings of the Board because members get the opportunity to listen to public testimony and hear residents’ ideas about Milwaukee County operations and services such as parks and transit.

The budget hearing will take place after several weeks of consideration of the County Executive’s 2015 budget proposal by the Board’s nine-member Finance, Personnel and Audit Committee. Following public comment, the Committee’s budget proposal will go before the full Board for adoption at its November 10 meeting.

**Free public** parking is available for attendees in the O’Donnell Park parking lot. Milwaukee County Transit System bus route 10 stops on Prospect Ave., across O’Donnell Park from the Museum. Routes 10, 12, 20, 23, 30, 31 and 137 serve the Downtown Transit Center on Wisconsin Ave. at Cass St., one block west of the Museum.

The Museum is wheelchair and stroller accessible. Special needs parking is available in the underground parking garage.

In addition, the exhibit “Of Heaven and Earth: 500 Years of Italian Painting from Glasgow Museums” will be free and open to attendees from 6:30 p.m. until 9:00 p.m.



## **Voter ID: Please help!**

Please note ***YOU WILL NEED TO SHOW VOTER ID TO VOTE ON NOVEMBER 4.*** I am providing the instructions sent to Dept. of Motor Vehicles for issuing IDs since the Governor has eliminated the requirement for a birth certificate.

I’d like to call on our South Shore residents to be good neighbors to our elderly who no longer drive and may not be able to provide documentation from the list below. The most common form of ID is the driver’s license, and many elderly citizens who have always taken time to vote may find they cannot comply with this new requirement. If you know an elderly neighbor who no longer drives, please offer to assist them by offering to drive to our local DMV in South

Milwaukee (College and Pennsylvania) to assist in obtaining this necessary identification. The formal requirements are set out below:

Last week, Gov. Scott Walker announced that, beginning Monday, residents without a copy of their birth certificate can go to a DMV branch and provide their birth date, and the state will verify the birth record free of charge. Previously, the government charged a fee for copies of birth certificates. Now, people will have to present proof of residency and proof of identity

(See below). You must request the ID be free of charge from the DMV, because it's for voting purposes. Please be sure you state this at DMV.

**For voters to prove their identity at the polls on November 4<sup>th</sup>, the correct listing of proof of identity other than the State of WI Driver's License includes (in part):**

**These are acceptable for voting purposes, and can be unexpired or expired after the date of the most recent general election (currently, the November 6, 2012 election):**

- A Wisconsin DOT-issued driver license, even if driving privileges are revoked or suspended
- A Wisconsin DOT-issued identification card
- A Wisconsin DOT-issued identification card or driver license without a photo issued under the religious exemption
- Military ID card issued by a U.S. uniformed service
- A U.S. passport

**These photo IDs are also acceptable for voting purposes, but must be unexpired:**


- A certificate of naturalization that was issued not earlier than two years before the date of an election at which it is presented
- A driving receipt issued by Wisconsin DOT (valid for 45 days)
- An identification card receipt issued by Wisconsin DOT (valid for 45 days)
- An identification card issued by a federally recognized Indian tribe in Wisconsin
- A photo identification card issued by a Wisconsin accredited university or college that contains date of issuance, signature of student, and an expiration date no later than two years after date of issuance. **Also, the university or college ID must be accompanied by a separate document that proves enrollment.**
- A citation or notice of intent to revoke or suspend a Wisconsin DOT-issued driver license that is dated within 60 days of the date of the election.

**Important things to know:**

- There is no such thing as a "Wisconsin Voter ID Card." The new Voter Photo ID Law uses existing photo IDs for people to prove their identity before voting.
- The address on your ID doesn't have to be current. And the name on your ID doesn't need to be an exact match for your name in the poll book. (So, Richards who go by Rich, Bobs who are also Roberts and Susans with IDs for Sue can all relax.)

- Of course, there are certain requirements. Your ID should look like you. Even if you've colored your hair, shaved your beard or lost some weight, as long as your photo ID reasonably resembles you, it should be accepted.


