NEW BUCKS BASKETBALL ARENA

As of this printing, our board is still waiting for details of the budget from Madison and whether Gov. Walker's plans for \$220 million in bonding for the arena will be included. Legislative leaders have indicated changes may be in the works.

Meanwhile, local board leadership has met with Bucks owners and managers. I met with Wes Edens on March 18 at the Bucks office along with the team President, Peter Feigin. I mostly listened while the Bucks explained their vision for the team and Milwaukee including the ancillary development that is envisioned with a new arena.

I did express my concern to Wes Edens regarding the county's need to fund our cultural institutions such as the Public Museum, the Zoo, Marcus Center, Art Museum, and our Parks. It is well documented that our county has substantial maintenance deficits. While all of our cultural assets serve the surrounding counties who attend these institutions in greater percentages than the home county (for example, the zoo has nearly 70% of its visitors from outside Milwaukee county), it is the taxpayers of the county that help support these cultural facilities without property tax support from the majority of the users.

I have asked the ownership of the Bucks to help connect the dots. Before we commit county assets to a new privately owned Bucks arena, how do we address this imbalance in an equitable way? Stay tuned.

O'DONNELL PARK AND THE MILWAUKEE ART MUSEUM

Just a few months after the board rejected a private purchase of O'Donnell Park and parking garage, a new proposal is being considered. I co-sponsored a resolution along with the Finance Chair Theo Lipscomb, Sr. and Board Chairwoman Marina Dimitrijevic to begin negotiations with the Milwaukee Art Museum for a public-to-public agreement for the running and maintenance of O'Donnell. This became an alternative to the County Executive's proposal to "float" a Request For Proposals (RFP) to

developers. I strongly disagree with our executive that a public, lakefront park should be declared excess property and sold off to the private sector for development. I am happy we are beginning to discuss the new arena since it may get these aggressive developers to change focus to the Park East that badly needs development and get them off their goal of grabbing lakefront property for their personal, private gain.

Our ancestors had the vision and foresight to set Milwaukee apart in keeping our lakeshore public. I ran for public office when my opponent set out this very theme in his campaign. While I understood that my constituents in voting for preservation of park land wanted to preserve our south shore parks, little did I know in 2007 this would become the fight of the century to preserve O'Donnell Park, the front door to the City and County of Milwaukee, which should be seen as the Museum and Festival Park District gateway, not the gold-digger coast.

This resolution was put on lay-over for one month, and I will give an update in my May newsletter. It also gives Milwaukee Art Museum a full month to begin their due diligence in exploring whether this will be financially viable for their institution. It will also give us a better chance to wait for our own audit to better define the much maligned information around the prior sale. So again, stay tuned.



SUPERVISOR PATRICIA JURSIK HONORS LATE OAK CREEK MAYOR ON BUS RIDE

Jursik Says Mayor Richard Bolender Pushed for Better Transit in Oak Creek

Milwaukee County Supervisor Patricia Jursik honored the late Oak Creek Mayor Richard Bolender by dedicating her inaugural bus ride on the newly expanded bus route in Oak Creek on March 23 to him. Bolender was mayor of Oak Creek from 2003 until his death in office in 2011.

While Mayor Bolender was immersed in Oak Creek's ambitious plans to develop the new Town Square on Howell Avenue, he encountered difficulties with developers. The Mayor told Jursik that the first question he was asked by developers was whether the new development was served by transit. The negative response caused these developers to turn to other areas. Mayor Bolender asked to have the county extend the current service on Howell Avenue which ended at College serving the MATC campus to the new Town Square.

"The Oak Creek area has been under-served by bus service for too long," Jursik said. "These new routes will bring people to areas such as industrial centers, Drexel Town Square, Target, Kohl's, Meijer's and many other businesses and residences along the way. Just after the county board announced the new extension, Oak Creek was able to bring in a new Froedtert Medical Clinic along this new route extension.

"Dick Bolender was a passionate supporter of bringing better bus service to Oak Creek when he was mayor, and I am proud to ride the bus in his honor," Jursik said. "When Mayor Bolender first asked for the extension, I knew it would be an uphill battle. During that same year, the Scott Walker administration's budget called for terminating all service in District 8 south of Oklahoma Avenue. I was fighting just to keep service along the south shore, much less get this extension for Oak Creek. I was thrilled to have an opportunity to work with my colleagues during the 2015 budget to realize this dream even though we had to fight a budget veto to get the extension.

"Mayor Bolender always let me know in no uncertain terms that Oak Creek needed better bus service. I know he would be happy to see the expanded route to job centers in his city." I was proud to ride the Rte 80 extension in honor of the former Mayor.

OAK CREEK PARKWAY STUDY

Along with Mayor Eric Brooks of South Milwaukee, the county, city and MMSD are exploring a joint project to undertake a comprehensive plan for restoration of the Oak Creek waterway and parkways. Initially we brought in Southeast Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission (SEWRPC) to prepare an initial plan and provide cost estimates. This initial project is now completed. On Monday March 30, the Mayor and I will meet with Kevin Shafer, director of the Water Council for MMSD and Parks Director John Dargle to coordinate and plan implementation.

Many constituents have been vocal about the Mill Pond clean up. However, there is a much more comprehensive discussion around the entire Oak Creek watershed that must be planned before we can address this one issue. This study will begin that comprehensive planning. While there has been much discussion, this plan should be our comprehensive outline for addressing the pollution and run off problems encountered in this watershed.


