## Bird City Award

The Parks Dept. received the Bird City, High Flyer Award. This is the highest honor that is awarded and given to the Parks Dept. for the many positive activities that help preserve and attract birds. My newsletters have often highlighted the lakefront parks as the source of great birding activities because of the migratory route along the Great Lakes. As always, this spring brought hundreds of birders to Sheridan, Warnimont, Grant and Bay View Parks in the 8th District. We should be proud of this recognition which was presented recently at Grant Park.



## Birding No-No

While we are on the subject of birds, please, please, please DO NOT FEED BIRDS IN THE PARK. I know many folks still continue to do this activity thinking that they are providing a kindness to the birds and even take their children and grandchildren along. First, bread is not good for the birds, they should be eating their natural diet of grasses. Secondly, bird dropping are one of the greatest causes of water pollution and run-off pollution. Feeding the birds is actually bad for our parks environment. Thirdly, feeding the birds in and around the airport creates a flight risk. The airport actually has a naturalist that from time to time will kill birds that fail to migrate to keep flight paths clear.

Feeding the birds such as Geese actually alters the migratory pattern of these large birds. Many geese now stay the entire winter instead of migrating south. This exasperates all of the problems listed above. I know we can change this negative behavior, but we all need to help. We have Do Not Feed signs around the ponds and beaches for a reason. Please do not ignore these signs. If you see others feeding the birds, politely remind our neighbors why this is a negative behavior, not a positive activity. Finally, the penalty for violating ordinance 47.07(2b), feeding prohibited of birds/wildlife is \$317.50.



Food and formula are supplied by Hunger Task Force, a supplier of free food to the hungry. Food is also donated from St. Stephen's Parishioners & community donors, and purchased from Feeding America.

## **Senior Stockboxes**

If you are a senior, living in Wisconsin on a fixed income, over 60 years, or if you care about someone who fits this description, sign them up for the monthly Stockbox program!

### **What?**

Stockboxes are free, pre-packaged boxes of food delivered to low-income senior housing sites, senior centers and the Family Life Center. They are filled with nutritious items that can round out a meal, offering a chance to enjoy more sit down occasions.

Items include: cheese, canned fruit, canned vegetables, juice, cereal, dried and canned milk, peanut butter, canned meat, dried beans, rice, instant potatoes or pasta.

### **Who?**

To receive a monthly Stockbox, individuals must be: a Wisconsin resident at least 60 years of age and have a monthly income below \$1,265 for a single person, \$1,705 for two people, add \$440 for each additional family member.


