SOUTH SHORE TERRACE NOW OPEN AT SOUTH SHORE PARK



South Shore Terrace, the new permanent expanded concessions at South Shore Park opened this month with a ribbon cutting by Sup. Marina Dimitrijevic, myself and Parks Director John Dargle, among others. We have been working on this improvement for several years. It was great to finally see the result. If you have not visited the new area at South Shore Park Pavilion, it is a must-see. The expanded concessions include a shaded patio, fire pits, vintage bar and entertainment on weekends. It is great for a gathering with friends and family while overlooking Lake Michigan and the Oak Leaf Trail, near the yacht club with the marina and boating. MillerCoors donated \$500,000 to this project. The original pavilion was built during the depression as a WPA project and of course your county taxes have supported this park for generations. It is wonderful to see new life poured into a treasured county asset.





SUPERVISOR PATRICIA JURSIK CONGRATULATES RICK BARRETT ON COUTURE PROJECT

But Chairwoman of Economic and Community Development Committee Asks for Assurances on Public Access

Milwaukee County Supervisor Patricia Jursik, Chairwoman of the Economic and Community Development Committee, today congratulated developer Rick Barrett after the group Preserve Our Parks decided not to appeal a court decision that allows the Couture to be built on the site of the Downtown Transit Center.

But she added that Barrett should assure public access to the 2.2-acre parcel, which she called a “gateway to downtown’s lakefront.”

“Rick Barrett has been a creative and talented developer in Milwaukee, but he has been given an unprecedented chance to build on some of the most prestigious acreage in the state,” Jursik said. “Barrett got this right without having to compete through a Request for Proposal process and is receiving the land without paying a premium price.”

Barrett, of Barrett Visionary Development, has an option to pay \$500,000 for the county-owned property. The \$122 million Couture project will feature apartments, restaurants, retail stores and a stop for the Milwaukee streetcar.

“As Chairwoman of the Economic and Community Development committee, I am always interested in acting in the best interests of economic development in Milwaukee County,” Jursik said. “But Preserve Our Parks had legitimate concerns over public access and I share those concerns. It is my hope that this developer is mindful of the public’s access and use of this site. Clearly, many of my constituents will be unable to afford apartments or perhaps even the restaurants and retail stores, but the public transit access and public plaza will be important to them. This developer must respect those public aspects of the project and even strengthen them going forward.

“I call upon Barrett to publicly state his commitment to public access, and I hope he will work to ensure that this project includes access for all Milwaukee County residents, not just the select few who can afford to live and shop there.”

RED ARROW PARK

A proposal came before the County Board in July to appoint a task force to determine if some action should be taken subsequent to the death of Dontre Hamilton, who was shot in the park by a police officer. This task force includes a veterans representative. Red Arrow Park is named after the Red Arrow Division and is across the street from the Marcus Center, one of the War Memorial structures in the county.

I am not opposed to a discussion of this topic and therefore allowed the task force to go forward. I did make a statement on the board floor with this comment: If the veterans (by this I mean the Veterans Council) do not fully approve of the recommendation, I shall not vote for the task force recommendation.

I did receive calls from constituents with questions. Some were under the impression that a memorial was approved. This is not correct. All the board did was to allow a task force to come together to enter into further discussion, which includes veteran representation.



BRT - BUS RAPID TRANSIT

Interest has been building on implementing a bus rapid transit (BRT) line in the east-west corridor paralleling I-94 in the greater Milwaukee area. Milwaukee County Executive Chris Abele announced in June that Milwaukee County would explore the development of BRT in the heavily traveled corridor between downtown Milwaukee and the Milwaukee Regional Medical Center in Wauwatosa. The Commission staff will be assisting Milwaukee County in this effort, at the request of the Milwaukee County Department of Transportation. Some months ago the Public Policy Forum issued a report urging Milwaukee area leaders to consider making significant transit travel improvements by providing one or more BRT routes, focusing in particular on the need to enhance transit travel from the City of Milwaukee to outlying Milwaukee and Waukesha County job centers. The Commission welcomes this renewed interest in pursuing implementation of long-standing Commission regional plan recommendations proposing the development of a system of express bus, or BRT, lines.

The following newsletter is devoted entirely to the BRT topic. It includes sections on: 1) current and long-standing SEWRPC plan recommendations attendant to BRT; 2) a discussion of the elements of BRT lines; and 3) a preview of what is being prepared for consideration in the Commission's VISION 2050 planning work with respect to BRT. 
