## Commuter Rail Moves Ahead

On November 15, 2008, The Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Transit Authority (RTA) recommended to the Governor and the Legislature that the State allow a .5% sales tax for commuter rail and county buses and grant the RTA the power to operate and sponsor all transit in Milwaukee, Racine, and Kenosha Counties.

The Kenosha-Racine-Milwaukee (KRM) commuter rail proposal from the RTA promises economic development for our South Shore communities. Using existing Union Pacific and Canadian Pacific rail lines, with development of train stations in Oak Creek, South Milwaukee, Cudahy, and Bay View, our communities would benefit from economic development and become a transportation corridor connecting riders with jobs from Chicago to Milwaukee and the communities between.

As is so often the case, the devil is in the details. A number of the recommendations made by the RTA would have an impact on transportation in Milwaukee County. Chairman Lee Holloway formed a task force to study the RTA proposal in depth report back to the Milwaukee County Board. The Chairman appointed me to chair this task force, and I am pleased that he also appointed Thomas Kujawa, an 8<sup>th</sup> District constituent and former head of the Milwaukee County Transit System, to participate in the task force. Our South Shore communities will be well represented.

The first meeting of this task force was held on December 29, 2008, to establish a working format and to organize a public hearing on the issue. The task force will consider various issues, including representation, elected membership, and funding. I look forward to developing suggestions that help meet the needs of our District and County.

## The State of Our Parks and Cultural Institutions


A report by the Public Policy Forum details challenges faced by Parks and cultural institutions supported by Milwaukee County. In response to budget pressures, these entities have put off maintenance and capital improvements. In our Parks System, roads, bridges, and parking lots demand the most attention, while buildings and recreation areas also need repair or replacement. Some cultural institutions have found creative ways to generate revenue. Milwaukee County's Parks System continues to offer low user fees compared to Wisconsin and national parks systems.
