### **SUPERVISOR JURSIK CONGRATULATES SUPERVISOR DIMITRIJEVIC**

**Milwaukee, WI** – Milwaukee County Supervisor Patricia Jursik is congratulating Supervisor Marina Dimitrijevic on her election as Chairwoman of the County Board of Supervisors.

“Supervisor Dimitrijevic ran a hard race, and her election as Chairwoman represents a new start for Milwaukee County. I look forward to her leadership for all of Milwaukee County,” Supervisor Jursik said. “Chairwoman Dimitrijevic and I have already forged a strong alliance on behalf of the entire South Shore from Bay View all along the lakefront to Oak Creek. I am excited that she is now in this important leadership role.”

Supervisor Jursik is correcting the [record](#) that was published in the *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel* on April 17, 2012. After over 20 votes were cast in a 3-way tie between Supervisors Dimitrijevic, Jursik, and Theodore Lipscomb, Sr., the article incorrectly stated that Supervisor Weishan had withdrawn from the race and that only one final vote was cast for Jursik, falsely implying that Jursik had stayed in the race voting for herself. The correct record should reflect that, after Supervisor Johnson withdrew, Supervisor Weishan remained an active candidate for Chair. Before the final ballot was cast for Supervisor Dimitrijevic, Supervisor Jursik asked her supporters to vote for any Supervisor of their choice for Chair. Supervisor Jursik’s final vote was cast for Supervisor Dimitrijevic. The lone vote for Jursik was cast by a different Supervisor.

“I hope all of the Supervisors, no matter how they voted in yesterday’s election for Chair, will come together and support our new Chairwoman, Marina Dimitrijevic,” Supervisor Jursik added. “We all need to work together for the good of our County residents. Our tasks will not be easy, but we can move forward if we are united in purpose.”
