PEDAL IN THE PARK WITH PAT THIS THURSDAY

County Supervisor Leads FREE Bike Ride to Advocate for Park and Trail Maintenance

Milwaukee, WI – Milwaukee County Supervisor Patricia Jursik invites 8th District constituents and bicycle enthusiasts in Milwaukee County to join her on a FREE bike ride this Thursday. Participants will meet at the Sheridan Park Pavilion and enjoy a family-friendly trip along the Oak Leaf Trail, visiting the northern part of Grant Park, and returning to Sheridan Pavilion in time for a concert from the “Bluegrass Allstars” at 6:30 p.m.

Supervisor Jursik sponsors the annual “Pedal in the Park with Pat” to call attention to deterioration of the bike path and the parks, and to coordinate efforts to improve these former jewels. The Oak Leaf Trail is a precious resource to residents of the 8th District and Milwaukee County. Originally designed as a 64-mile trail in 1939, it currently stretches 106 miles, connecting residents throughout the County.

During her nearly 3 years on the Milwaukee County Board, Supervisor Jursik has advocated for the maintenance of Milwaukee County’s trails and Parks.
