SOUTH MILWAUKEE GOES PINK

City to show support in the fight against breast cancer

South Milwaukee, WI – Mayor Tom Zepecki has declared Tuesday, October 19, a citywide day to support the fight against breast cancer. The Common Council; Mayor; Milwaukee County Supervisor Patricia Jursik and staff; as well as staff of the City Clerk’s office, City Treasurer’s office and City Hall administrative offices; school system; Police, Health, Fire and Street departments; water filtration and wastewater treatment plants; Library; Chester W. Grobschmidt Senior Center; Franciscan Villa; Bucyrus International and PyraMax Bank will wear pink that day.

The “City of South Milwaukee – Dressing Pink for Breast Cancer Day” is being held in cooperation with Justice for a Cure 2010, a law enforcement partnership with Susan G. Komen for the Cure.

On October 19 at 7 p.m., the Common Council will host a representative from Susan G. Komen for the Cure and the Mayor will read the City’s proclamation declaring October 19 “Justice for a Cure Day” in South Milwaukee.

“I would like to recognize the leadership of Police Chief Ann Wellens and Mayor Tom Zepecki and express gratitude for residents and businesses who contribute to breast cancer research,” said Supervisor Jursik. “I am wearing pink on October 19 in support of families affected by breast cancer and to raise awareness about the need for a cure.”
