


Viewing Updated Floodplain Delineations Using the Milwaukee County *Interactive Mapping Service*

1) Locate and Open the “Draft Floodplain Mapping” Layers


In the Layer List (below), locate the Regulatory group layer. Click on the  icon to the left of the Regulatory group layer to display the layers that are available in that group. The layers that contain the updated 100-year & 500-year floodplain delineations are found under “Draft Floodplain Mapping” in the Regulatory group; click on the  icon to the left of “Draft Floodplain Mapping” to reveal these layers.

Click the checkbox to the right of a layer’s name to ensure that features in that layer will be visible in the map window.




2) Find an Updated Floodplain's Location on the Map


Click on the "Regulatory Layers Attribute Search" tool located in the Search Toolbar:



In the dialogue box that appears, select "Draft Flood Areas" from the "Query" drop-down list, and in the "Region" drop-down list, select an area where floodplain delineations have been updated:



In the Report dialogue box that appears after a draft floodplain area is chosen, click on “Zoom to Feature” to center the map window’s display on the area of interest:
