

Buckhorn State Park, High Cliff State Park, Kettle Moraine State Forest (Ottawa Lake), Kohler-Andrae, Mirror Lake State Park, Potawatomi State Park & Richard Bong State Recreation Area

The State Park system is ready to begin accepting applications for 2015 to the seven wheelchair accessible full-size cabins, one each at Buckhorn State Park, High Cliff State Park, Kettle Moraine State Forest at Ottawa Lake, Kohler-Andrea State Park, Mirror Lake State Park, Potawatomi State Park and the Richard Bong State Recreation Area.

RUSTIC ACCESSIBLE CABINS

Blue Mound State Park & Copper Falls State Park

The State Park system is also ready to begin accepting applications for 2015 to the two wheelchair accessible rustic cabins, one each at Blue Mound State Park & Copper Falls State Park. These cabins are approximately 13' x 13' and are designed to accommodate four people. The cabins do not contain a restroom and cooking is only allowed outside in a fire ring. The rustic cabins are designed for people with physical limitations that prohibit them from taking part in traditional camping.

SNOW REMOVAL - DID YOU KNOW?

Okay, we don't want to think about it, right? Unless you're one of those people who like a snowy Wisconsin winter, this can be a frustrating time to get around. Here's some information to keep in mind.



Did you know that it is illegal to plow snow into an "accessible parking" stall? Wisconsin law calls for fine of up to \$40.00 for the first offense and up to \$100.00 for the second and subsequent offenses.

WI statute 346.503 Parking spaces for vehicles displaying special registration plates or special identification cards.

(2e) The owner or lessee subject to the requirements of sub.(1m) shall keep the parking spaces reserved for vehicles designated under sub. (1m) or (2m) clear of snow and ice in a timely manner and make other reasonable efforts to ensure that the spaces are available for use by a motor vehicle used by a physically disabled person.

346.56 Penalty for violating sections 346.503 to 346.55. (1g) Any person violating s.346.503 (2e) shall forfeit not less than \$20.00 nor more than \$40.00 for the first offense. For a 2nd or subsequent conviction within 3 years, person shall forfeit not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$100.00.





Bus Stop Barrier Busters Advance Efforts in 2014

Happy Holidays! With the arrival of winter, temperatures and snowflakes are falling and soon enough, the mounds will be piling up! The white fluff is fun to play in, but not fun to travel in, especially when irresponsible neighbors forget to shovel or ice their sidewalks. Does icy, cold, white slop prevent you from accessing the bus? Not to fear, the Bus Stop Barrier Buster is here! The Milwaukee County Transit System (MCTS) and the Transit Plus' New Freedom staff are pleased to inform you that the 2014 barrier removal program was extremely successful, with **104** new ADA-compliant bus pads and four shelters already in place, and a few more expected to be installed before the end of the year.



In November, the expert crews from the Milwaukee County Highway Department completed 11 new stops in South Milwaukee along 15th Avenue. Specifically, the new pads have improved access to South Milwaukee High School,

Middle School and the Performing Arts Center via Route 52. Another area that was targeted for improvement is the neighborhood around Mitchell International Airport, thanks to numerous inquiries from bus riders about the lack of accessible bus pads that exist. The intersection of Howell and Layton Avenues was the main priority, with three of the four island landing pads needing drastic accessibility improvements. Thirteen pads will be installed on Howell and Edgerton Avenues, as well as 6th Street for Route 80 and the Green Line. One beautiful new shelter has been installed on the southeast corner of 27th Street. and National Avenue, just in time to offer protection from the brutal, unpredictable, Wisconsin winter weather!

But wait, there's more! Two additional bus shelters are also planned to be installed this year! One at the southwest corner of 9th Street and Winnebago Avenue for The Brewery development at the former Pabst

Brewery Complex and the other will be a brand new shelter in front of the new Goodwill office building in Greendale along Route 64 on 60th Street and Greenway. Both will offer cover from the stinging wind as well as the frigid rain and sleet that plague Milwaukee all winter long!

With the impending snowy season rapidly approaching, MCTS gives a friendly reminder and encourages all riders and residents to spread the word on the importance of snow removal at bus stops, as well as sidewalks and curb ramps. Keeping the ice and snow clear is crucial to people who have difficulty with mobility, as well as strollers and carts. The lack of a cleared path can prevent someone from even leaving their home, so remember to shovel and salt!!

Along with improving access to buses for its customers, MCTS launched its new fare system this fall with the MCTS M*CARD. The card is available now at retailers across Milwaukee County. Customers can purchase 1, 7 or 31-day passes on the MCTS M*CARD or load an amount up to \$100 as stored value (pay-per-use). For a full list of locations and additional details on the M-Card, please visit www.ridemcts.com.

In 2014, our goal was to surpass the 45 bus pads installed in 2013, improving accessibility to all MCTS passengers, and we crushed that goal! As always, the New Freedom team highly encourages riders to let us know of any non-accessible stops on any routes; we appreciate your comments. 
