

WTBBL has about 100,000 books, 300 newspapers, and 70 magazines for you to choose from. 



SOCIAL SECURITY UPDATES

MEDICARE IS HERE TO STAY

Medicare went into effect 48 years ago on July 1, 1966. Earlier that same year, Medicare workers went door to door trying to get seniors to sign up. Medicare was not the cornerstone then that it is today and people did not know whether it was going to work for the long haul.

Now, nearly half a century later, Medicare remains one of the most popular government programs in the nation.

We can't see the future, but one thing's for sure: Medicare is here to stay. Medicare provides health insurance to more than 50 million Americans. Forty-two million are people age 65 and older and the other 8 million are younger and have disabilities.

Most people first become eligible for Medicare at age 65.

The four parts of Medicare are parts A, B, C, and D.

- **Part A** (Hospital Insurance) helps cover inpatient hospital care, skilled nursing care, hospice care, and home health care. Most people get Medicare Part A premium-free since it is earned by working and paying Social Security taxes.
- **Part B** (Medical Insurance) helps cover services from doctors and other outpatient health care providers, outpatient care, home health care, durable medical equipment, and some preventive services. Most people pay a monthly premium for Part B. In 2014, the premium for most people is \$104.90, the same as it was in 2013. Some high-income individuals pay more than the standard premium. Your Medicare Part B premium also can be higher if you do not enroll when you are first eligible, also known as your initial enrollment period. There also is a Medicare Part B deductible of \$147 in 2014.
- **Part C** (Medicare Advantage) allows you to choose to receive all of your health care services through a provider organization. This plan includes all benefits and services covered under Part A and Part B, usually includes Medicare prescription drug coverage, and may include extra benefits and services at an extra cost. You must have Part A and Part B to enroll in Part C. Monthly premiums vary depending on your state, private insurer, and whether you select a health maintenance organization or a preferred provider organization.
- **Part D** (Medicare prescription drug coverage) helps cover the cost of prescription drugs. Many people pay a premium for Part D. However, people with low income and resources may qualify for *extra help* from

Social Security to pay the premium and deductible. To see if you qualify for extra help visit www.socialsecurity.gov/prescriptionhelp.

Will you be age 65 soon? Even if you decide not to retire, you should consider applying for Medicare. You can apply in less than 10 minutes using our online Medicare application. Do it today at www.socialsecurity.gov/medicareonly.

IS A NEW SOCIAL SECURITY CARD IN YOUR CARDS?

To help combat the rising threat of fraud and identity theft, Social Security will no longer issue Social Security number printouts beginning in August 2014. If you need written confirmation of your Social Security number—perhaps your new employer needs verification—and you can't find your Social Security card, you can apply for a replacement.

But do you really need a replacement? In most cases, you don't need your card as long as you know your number. For all intents and purposes, your number *is* your card. Usually providing your number and identifying information is enough.

In the event you really do want or need a replacement card, either for yourself or for a child, you can find all of the details you need at www.socialsecurity.gov/ssnumber. The "Social Security Number and Card" page provides information on how to obtain a replacement card and what specific documents you need to provide.

Need a Social Security card for your new baby to claim him or her as a dependent on your tax return or to apply for government or social service benefits? In most cases, an application for your newborn's Social Security card and number is taken in the hospital when you apply for your baby's birth certificate. If not, you can request one for your child the same way you do for yourself.

Whether you need a Social Security card for yourself or your child, it's easy—and free—to apply for one. But consider whether a new Social Security card is really in the cards for you. It may be that your "card" is already with you—in your head.

While you're at our website, open your free *my Social Security* account at www.socialsecurity.gov/myaccount. It can help you plan for retirement, check your earnings history, request your *Social Security Statement*, and more. 

All electronics will be accepted, but there will be a small fee for recycling televisions. The computers that are collected will be refurbished by our Computer Recycling Program volunteers and given to people with disabilities at no charge.

IndependenceFirst is working in partnership with AT&T, Digital Recyclers, River Run Computers, Rocket Clicks and the Pettit National Ice Center to host this annual event.



The vision of the volunteer-driven Computer Recycling Program (CRP) is to "bridge the technology divide." We know that people with disabilities do not always have access to computers and in this day and age applying for jobs and looking for resources are mostly done online.

The CRP distributes about 350 computers a year. In 2013, CRP volunteers donated approximately 4,000 hours of service. The volunteers rebuild the computers, schedule appointments and teach the people receiving computers how to hook up and operate their computer.





CAREGIVER CORNER - HAVE A FAMILY MEETING BEFORE A CRISIS SITUATION

Why have a family meeting? Too often a family meeting is delayed until the individual in need has a health or housing relocation crisis. They are frequently held informally through discussion during the holidays or at special family events. However, when family meetings are held because of a crisis or during informal activities, discussion can be fragmented and often not everyone involved is consulted.

Is a family meeting always needed? Some families who frequently communicate by telephone or face-to-face and understand the need to "share" caregiving functions may not need a family meeting. However, this scenario is rare. A family meeting can still be a nice way to check

on whether or not everyone feels they are being treated fairly or kept in the communication loop.

How do you hold a "family meeting?" The meeting should be kept as small as possible, only attended by those individuals who will have direct decision-making or care involvement. If the individual or older adult is mentally competent, he or she needs to be involved in all decisions about his or her own care and attend all family meetings.

A basic agenda should be developed to keep the meeting on track. Before the meeting everyone should be able to give their input on the topics for discussion and no one's ideas should be discounted. Fundamentals like frequency, respect while talking, length of talking, place for meetings and goals for meetings, etc. should also be laid out. If relationships are strained, a neutral third party such as a social worker or (geriatric) care manager trained in offering family meetings may be a good person to have at meetings. Remember to be flexible, the outline can change and develop with future meetings and as care needs change.

If the only time all family members can get together is during the holidays, schedule a special time, possibly the day after the holiday, for a family meeting. Then whenever discussion about caregiving is brought up, there can be a reminder that it will be discussed "tomorrow." Everyone can then enjoy the holidays and complete attention can be given to discussing caregiving concerns during the meeting.



BUS STOP BARRIER BUSTERS ADVANCE EFFORTS IN 2014

The summer weather has arrived and there are plenty of activities to attend practically every day of the week. The pesky barriers that exist may prevent you from gaining access to the bus to get to your fun event, but have no fear, the barrier buster is here! Milwaukee County Transit System (MCTS) and the Transit Plus' New Freedom staff are pleased to let you know that the 2014 barrier removal program is well underway, with brand new ADA-compliant bus pads already in place.



The expert crews from the Milwaukee County Highway Department have completed new stops along the Routes 52 and 51 in Bayview, as well as two in downtown Milwaukee at 6th Street and Juneau Avenue on the Route 80 and Jackson and Mason Streets on the Route 15. With the assistance of the City of Greenfield, 12 new pads were also installed along Layton Avenue from 76th Street to the Hales Corners Park Ride Lot. The extension of Route 55 will increase accessibility to many popular destinations in Greenfield. The busy intersection of 76th Street and North Avenue will become more accessible with the addition of new ramps on each of the four islands where the bus stops are located. Currently there are no curb cuts, which limit riders' abilities to get on and off the bus.

Next, the crews will head to the Village of Whitefish Bay and install bus pads along Hampton Avenue, Marlborough Drive and Wilson Drive. The completion of the pads in Whitefish Bay will eliminate all of the non-compliant ADA stops that were identified in the village. Also, the Village of West Milwaukee, which has become a major shopping and dining destination with its

centralized location and close proximity to Miller Park, will receive new pads along Miller Park Way on the Route 56, as well as Burnham Street on the Route 54.

In 2014, our goal is to surpass the 45 bus pads installed in 2013, improving accessibility to MCTS riders. As always, the New Freedom team highly encourages riders to let us know of any non-accessible stops on any routes; we appreciate comments from riders. 

COUNTY EXECUTIVE INTERNSHIP PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Purpose: It is the purpose of this program to provide meaningful educational opportunities for undergraduate and graduate level students within the Executive Office of Milwaukee County Government while providing support to full-time staff.



Requirements: Students should be enrolled full-time or part-time in an undergraduate or higher program. Preference will be given students whose field relates directly to the activities of the County Executive's Office. These may include, but are not limited to, fields such as political science, public administration, economic development, urban studies, journalism, public relations, and communications.

Ideal applicants should exhibit the following qualities:

- strong written and verbal communication skills
- a calm and positive attitude in the face of difficult situations
- a commitment to public service
- strong work ethic
- the ability to work independently on tasks

Students should be able to devote 10-15 hours per week to their internship.

All internships with the office of the County Executive are unpaid. Students may perform the internship for credit provided that any assignments pertaining to the office are approved by staff before submission to the school.

Activities of Interns: Interns will work alongside the full-time staff of the Executive Office. Interns may be involved in some or all of the following: constituent service issues, research pertaining to issues being discussed by the Executive's office and the County Board, drafting of Executive Proclamations, responding to scheduling requests, and creating briefings/talking points for the County Executive.
