



VISION WALK 2014

The 2014 Walk Committee welcomes all residents of Wisconsin to our 6th Annual Wisconsin VisionWalk in Veteran's Park on the lakefront in Milwaukee on Sunday, **May 18, 2014**. Last year, nearly 900 people of the community affected by blinding diseases were joined by their friends and family to walk for a cure. They hope to welcome over 1,000 people this year, and they are asking for your help!



VisionWalk is in support of the Foundation Fighting Blindness, which is the world's largest private funder of retinal degenerative diseases such as retinitis pigmentosa (RP), macular degeneration, Usher syndrome, Stargardt disease, and LCA. The Foundation has been part of some very exciting new research which may someday soon lead to a cure for these diseases that affect more than 10 million Americans.

Walk Chairs Nicole Everson and Kelly Savasta are supporting VisionWalk because the cause is very near to both of them. Nicole has Ushers Syndrome, and Kelly has Stargardt. Until the last couple years, there hasn't been much promising research and potential for a cure. The Foundation has given them and many others hope that there is a cure in sight.

Nicole and Kelly have had teams from the very start of VisionWalk, and Nicole's team has raised more than \$10,000 on multiple occasions! She didn't have any big corporate contacts to help her raise that amazing amount ... just a lot of generous friends, family and co-workers who combined for a BIG total.

The 5K walk is a family-friendly event benefitting the entire state of Wisconsin and its resident, and is free to anyone and everyone, including pets! There will be bounce houses and giant inflatable slide, provided by Music On the Move Plus, the largest event management company in Milwaukee. The family of owner Taj Jordan has five members affected with vision loss, and has jumped on board to provide much of the equipment for the walk.

There will also be a lot of other fun stuff, including popular Milwaukee entertainer Eric Barbieri. VisionWalk will also have fire trucks, Ger-Bear the Clown, a face painter, mascots from area sports teams (Bango from

the Bucks, Roscoe from the Admirals, and Star Wars characters), and a whole lot more. There will also be a free lunch served after the walk.





SOCIAL SECURITY UPDATE

FASTER BENEFIT DECISIONS FOR VETERANS

On Memorial Day, as we pay tribute to the men and women who gave the ultimate sacrifice for our country, we also share some news about Social Security disability benefits for veterans with disabilities: a new expedited disability process.

We believe it is important to recognize those who currently serve in the military as well as those injured in the line of duty and consider it an honor and a duty to serve them. Whether the injury is physical or mental, getting a decision about Social Security disability benefits from your government shouldn't add to the problems faced by the injured.

Carolyn W. Colvin, Acting Commissioner of Social Security, recently unveiled a new initiative to expedite disability applications from veterans with a Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) disability compensation rating of 100 percent Permanent and Total (P&T). Under the new process, Social Security will treat these veterans' applications as high priority and issue expedited decisions, similar to the way we currently handle disability claims from wounded warriors.

"Our veterans have sacrificed so much for our country and it is only right that we ensure they have timely access to the disability benefits they may be eligible for and deserve," said Acting Commissioner Colvin. GIVE YOUR MOM SOME EXTRA HELP

Mother's Day is right around the corner. It's always nice to give Mom a card, flowers or candy, but this year, people all over the country are helping their moms save an estimated \$4,000 annually on the cost of Medicare

prescription drugs. You can help your mom too—and it won't cost you a dime.

If your mother has Medicare coverage and has limited income and resources, she may be eligible for *Extra Help*—available through Social Security—to pay part of her monthly premiums, annual deductibles and prescription co-payments.

To figure out whether your mother is eligible, Social Security needs to know her income and the value of her savings, investments and real estate (other than the home she lives in). To qualify for the *Extra Help*, she must receive Medicare and have:

- Income limited to \$17,505 for an individual or \$23,595 for a married couple living together. Even if your mom's annual income is higher, she still may be able to get some help. Some examples where income may be higher include if she and, if married, her spouse:
 - Support family members who live with them;
 - Have earnings from work; or
 - Live in Alaska or Hawaii.
- Resources limited to \$13,440 for an individual or \$26,860 for a married couple living together. Resources include such things as bank accounts, stocks and bonds. We do not count her house or car as resources.

We have an easy-to-use online application that you can help Mom complete. You can find it at www.socialsecurity.gov/prescriptionhelp. To apply by phone or have an application mailed to you, call Social Security at 1-800-772-1213 (TTY 1-800-325-0778) and ask for the *Application for Help with Medicare Prescription Drug Plan Costs* (SSA-1020).



Last year, MCTS staff was busy installing new or repairing bus stop pads in the public right-of-way that were originally grass, dirt, gravel or non-compliant stops. Overall, 2013 was the most successful year busting bus stops by updating forty-four bus pads to ADA standards around Milwaukee County spanning seven municipalities.



However, MCTS is looking to the future in 2014 and we want your help! Our staff will continue to busting bus stops into 2014 to remove bus stop barriers and upgrade bus stops through Milwaukee County. Our staff welcomes transit users to report inaccessible locations that limit your use of MCTS buses. Please contact us, if you know of any bus stops in the public right-of-way that could be made accessible by replacing grass, dirt, or gravel with concrete or removing other barriers such as benches or newspaper holders.





U.S. ACCESS BOARD LAUNCHES ONLINE GUIDES TO THE ADA AND ABA STANDARDS

The U.S. Access Board has launched new online guides on the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Accessibility Standards and the Architectural Barriers Act (ABA) Accessibility Standards. This web-based material features illustrated technical guides that explain and clarify requirements of the ADA and ABA standards, answer common questions, and offer best practice recommendations. It also includes a series of animations on various subjects covered by the standards.



"The Board is very excited to offer this series of technical guides and animations to help users understand the requirements of the ADA and ABA Standards and how they can be met," states Access Board Member Michael Graves, FAIA. "As a practicing architect, I know from experience how valuable this type of guidance is in following the standards and ensuring accessibility."

The initial installment of the guide covers the first three chapters of the standards, including application and use of the standards (Chapter 1), scoping in new construction, alterations, and additions (Chapter 2), and basic "building block" technical provisions (Chapter 3). Guides covering other sections of the standards will be released at a later date. The supplementary animations, which range in length from 6 to 10 minutes, address wheelchair maneuvering, doors and entrances, and accessible toilet and bathing facilities.

"These new resources not only explain requirements in the standards but also demonstrate their rationale," notes Graves. "Knowing the 'whys' behind various provisions is key to understanding what accessibility means and how best to achieve it."

The [Guide to the ADA Standards](#) covers design requirements that apply to places of public accommodation, commercial facilities, and state and local government facilities subject to the ADA in new construction, alterations, and additions. The [Guide to the ABA Standards](#) addresses similar standards that apply under the ABA to facilities that are designed, constructed, altered, or leased with federal funds.

Future installments to the guides will be published as they become available. Users can [sign-up](#) to receive email updates on the release of new technical guides in the series.

There's plenty to keep professionals in the I/DD field awake at night – an unsustainable Medicaid system, economic uncertainty, and supported employment numbers that have remained flat for decades. Finally, we will look at ways we continue to learn from the people we support; specifically, what people with Down syndrome are teaching us that absolutely no one else can.



FAMILY CAREGIVER SUPPORT NETWORK
FOR FAMILY MEMBERS AND FRIENDS WHO HELP OR CARE FOR OLDER ADULTS

Starting Family Involvement in Caregiving and Planning
For Family Members and Friends Who Help or Care For Older Adults

Have you found yourself more involved in the daily life and cares of a loved one who has been living independently? Perhaps you are providing meals, rides, house work, home chores or reminder calls. Are you beginning to think they are not safe or need to make some changes? As long as your loved one is mentally competent the first step in the planning process is to discuss your concerns with them. If your (older) family member doesn't see a need for help, possibly he or she doesn't need help. Health research indicates that (older) adults generally stay healthier the longer they stay independent. Dependency on care can become convenient, and sometimes abused. Independence and self-care should be encouraged as long as it is safe to do so.

It is common for (older) adults to deny that they need help or need a change. Recognizing the need for help can mean acknowledging health deterioration and loss of independence. Often pride and a resistance to the change in family roles can get in the way. However, note that close family members or friends can also sometimes be overly concerned and the (older) adult indeed may not need help.

If your (older) adult denies needing help but you still think it is needed, it may be time to get another opinion. The best way to do this is to have another family member or friend of the adult become involved. Later with this person present, bring the topic up with your (older) adult in a general, non-confrontational way, focusing on your concerns and not the (older) adult's attitude. If you are both in agreement that help is needed, this person can support your views at a family meeting – the next step.

Ideally, an (older) adult will acknowledge when help is needed or request assistance. Also, in the ideal world, all family members will agree on how help will be provided. However, in the real world, there often can be conflict about whether help is needed and who is going to provide it. A family meeting is a good way to work things out, answer questions and make sure that everyone is on the same page. Also, the best way to get help from family members is to involve them in the planning process from the start.

Planning for the first family meeting may or may not include the (older) adult because he or she may feel confronted and invisible as others discuss care needs. During the initial planning process, family members should write a list of their concerns related to the (older) adult. (What was working before that isn't working now?) The list below can be used as a guideline for topics to discuss to determine issues and possible care.

The first family meeting should include the (older) adult. Because they have been previously approached, concerns expressed in the meeting should be less of a surprise. The list of concerns developed when planning

the meeting should be available to everyone so no concerns are missed. The following list can also help keep the focus on the concerns rather than wandering on to other topics.

Topics for First Family Meeting:

Bring up each of these areas of concern at the first family meeting, even if you don't think they apply to your (older) adult's situation. Some people at the meeting may be aware of certain concerns while others aren't. If all or some exist, care is probably needed.

Mental Health-More confusion, communication problems and unusual mood swings.

Personal Mobility- Walks more slowly, avoids walking or climbing steps, or feels unstable in movement.

Housing- Has frequent falls, is no longer able to perform basic living tasks on his/her own, is overwhelmed by house or property upkeep.

Medication Use and Abuse-Sometimes forgets to take medications, doesn't like new medication or refuses to take medication. Prescriptions are disappearing, needing to be filled more frequently, becomes reluctant or defensive when talking about medications, seems unusually confused or clumsy.

Meals-Forgets to eat, no longer wants to prepare meals, lost interest in food, needs help with grocery shopping, frequently allows food to spoil, or cannot eat unaided.

Alcohol Use-Liquor bottles appear in garbage or in home with disturbing frequency, smells of liquor, seems impaired by liquor or significant personality or physical change (i.e. complains of fever) when drinking liquor in social setting.

Finances-Needs help with banking, paying bills, balancing the checkbook or handling health or other insurance claims.

Safety-Forgets to lock doors or turn off oven, may have problems using household cleaning products or distinguishing from food, or leaves things on floor as hazards for tripping.

Housekeeping-Cleaning habits have changed, allows garbage, mail or newspapers to pile up, seems overwhelmed at ability to maintain home, or postpones or asks for help doing laundry.

Social life-Has cut back on social activity, needs prompting to get involved with friends and former social activities, or seems disinterested in family activities.

Driving-Experiences some lapses in judgment behind the wheel, sometimes ignores stop signs or lights, recently gotten tickets or been involved in an accident, or no longer wants to drive at night or for certain distances.

Personal Care-Baths less frequently, has incidents of incontinence, neglects hair, shaving or teeth, periodically stays in bed clothes until later in the day or wears unclean clothes.

Shopping-Doesn't want to walk for time needed for grocery or other shopping, shops less frequently, hasn't purchased new clothes for longer than normal for older adult, or lacks food staples normally kept.

Telephone Use-Seems distracted or confused when speaking on telephone, has difficulty using telephone book, or makes telephone calls less frequently.

Hint: The best way to get help from family members is to involve them in the planning process from the start.






