





Summer is just around the corner. Do you know a child who needs adaptive equipment at home?



Variety - The Children's Charity of Wisconsin can provide funding for mobility and adaptive equipment for children (up through age 21) who have any type of physical disability and live in Wisconsin.

From standers and gait trainers for therapy to lifts and ramps for transferring, Variety can fund all sorts of equipment for children with physical disabilities. We can even fund communication devices for home use for children who have successfully used a device in therapy this year. We also fund wheelchairs, positioning chairs, adaptive bicycles*, sports chairs, strollers and much more!

Talk to the parents of children you work with before school is out about applying to Variety! As part of the application process, the child's therapist or doctor is asked to write a referral letter, explaining how the child will benefit from the equipment.



FROM TYPEWRITERS TO MEGABYTES

The first typewriter to be commercially successful was invented on June 23, 1868. One hundred years later, Social Security still used the same technology to type Social Security cards, envelopes, forms, and applications. This system required thousands of employees to create, maintain, transmit, and file the folder for each current and future beneficiary by hand to ensure accurate payments to retirees and disability beneficiaries.

Of course, that has all changed with modern computers and the Internet. Now, you don't even need to leave the comfort of your home to do the majority of your business with Social Security. Your first step in embracing the future is creating your own, personal *my Social Security* account.

Setting up a *my Social Security* account is quick, secure, and easy. More than 18 million Americans already have accounts. In fact, someone opens one about every 6 seconds. Join the crowd and sign up today at www.socialsecurity.gov/myaccount. With a personalized *my Social Security* account, you can:

- Obtain an instant, personalized estimate of your future Social Security benefits;
- Verify the accuracy of your earnings record — your future benefit amounts are based on your earnings record;
- Change your address and phone number, if you receive monthly Social Security benefits;
- Sign up for or change direct deposit of your Social Security benefits;
- Get a replacement SSA-1099 or SSA-1042S for tax season; and
- Obtain estimates of the Social Security and Medicare taxes you've paid.

SOCIAL SECURITY SUPPORTS NATIONAL CANCER SURVIVORS DAY

In 2015, more than a million people will be diagnosed with cancer. This alarming statistic affects people and families all over the world. On June 7, 2015, we observe National Cancer Survivors Day in the United States. In support of this day, Social Security encourages checkups, early detection, and awareness, while honoring the survivors who have gone through this battle and defeated the disease.

Social Security stands strong in our support of the fight against cancer. We offer services to patients suffering from this disease through our disability program and our Compassionate Allowances program. Compassionate Allowances are cases with medical conditions so severe they obviously meet Social Security's disability standards, allowing us to quickly process the cases with minimal medical information.

There is no special application or form you need to submit for Compassionate Allowances. Simply apply for disability benefits using the standard Social Security or Supplemental Security Income (SSI) application. Once we identify you as having a Compassionate Allowances condition, we'll expedite your disability application.

Social Security establishes Compassionate Allowances conditions using information received at public outreach hearings, from the Social Security and disability Determination services communities, from medical and scientific experts, and based on our research. 



GO PASS

@RideMCTS



Starting on March 31, the [Growing Opportunities \(GO\) Pass](#) has provided thousands of eligible residents with transportation across Milwaukee County.

The GO Pass program is coordinated by the Milwaukee County Transit System (MCTS) and provides free fixed route bus service on all mainline routes operated by MCTS, including travel on MCTS Freeway Flyers, bus services to lakefront festivals and to Miller Park. Transit Plus fees are unchanged.

To be eligible for the GO Pass an individual must be: a resident of Milwaukee County, possess a government issued identification card, and either be 65 years or older, or have a disability that impacts his or her ability to travel.

Application forms and additional information can be found at: RideMCTS.com. Application processing is available between 9 A.M. to 2 P.M., Monday through Friday at the MCTS Administration Building located at 1942 N. 17th Street. During the month of June, GO Pass staff will visit several Milwaukee County senior sites. [For details about which locations](#), call 414-343-1700 or view online at RideMCTS.com.

Because the program has been extremely popular, the enrollment process has, at times, resulted in long wait times. During the initial month of the program, some 5,000 individuals received their GO Passes and are now enjoying the conveniences of travel on our modern, accessible fleet of buses. In the upcoming months, we anticipate that many more people will sign up for the program and expand their travel options and newfound freedom. Welcome aboard



Every day you are called upon to listen, to support, to take care of and to fix many of your loved ones concerns and issues. It often doesn't matter that you may be having a difficult day and many times you can have several major issues all occurring at the same time. Everyone wants a piece of you. Changes of hopes, dreams and future plans are an everyday reality. On top of this, you are grieving as the person you know, loved and/or remembered is no longer present with you, emotionally or physically. These are the difficult days of grief.

Keep in mind that grieving is fatiguing. Often after the death of a loved one, you feel lost, like a ship without an anchor. You are working on redefining your role as to who you are. Am I still a wife/husband, a mother/father, a grandmother/grandfather, a daughter/son? Where do I fit now that my loved one is no longer with me? Each person's grief is unique and does not fit neatly into a box. Grief is fatigue, insomnia and aches and pains. Grief is sadness, anxiety, guilt, anger and jealousy. Grief may be feelings of guilt because you are relieved of your responsibilities. Grief is sleep disturbances and dreams. Grief is screaming/crying or complete numbness. Any of these reactions are normal and expected. Grief is often described as an emotional roller coaster with highs and lows along the way. Grief has no right or wrong way and it is never the same for any two people. There is only your way to grieve. Grief is unique and normal to you! At this time, it is essential to give yourself "permission to grieve" and to "feel" whatever it is that you are experiencing. Grief is not something we "get over." You cannot go around grief, in the middle or over it, you must go through grief. Coping with death is a personal experience and something no other person can share in exactly the same way. Pain and tears become you. Remember that tears are not a sign of weakness, but a sign of strength. Tears speak to your feelings about your loved one and about the relationship that you had.

A way that you can assist yourself is to find others who can relate to your grief. Seek out a support group. The beauty of a support group is finding others who recognize what you are feeling. You are not alone...you are not going crazy and you can survive! Seek out emotional nourishment...hugs...laughter and a sense of humor all help you cope and replenish your emotions so you can start again the next day. As a caregiver, know that you did the best you could do at any given time. Do something nice for yourself...read a book, take a long walk, enjoy a bubble bath or even indulge in a hot fudge sundae! Give yourself permission to be less than perfect. After the death of your loved one, you feel lost, like a ship without an anchor. You are redefining your roles and establishing a new set of goals of what you want out of life. This is a difficult process. Time, sharing and connecting with caregivers who also have experienced grief can help you define a "new normal."
