ADA & OTHER FEDERAL LAWS PROTECTING THE RIGHTS OF VOTERS WITH DISABILITIES

Voting is one of our nation's most fundamental rights and a hallmark of our democracy. Yet for too long, many people with disabilities have been excluded from this core aspect of citizenship. People with intellectual or mental health disabilities have been prevented from voting because of prejudicial assumptions about their capabilities. People who use wheelchairs or other mobility aids, such as walkers, have been unable to enter the polling place to cast their ballot because there was no ramp. People who are blind or have low vision could not cast their vote because the ballot was completely inaccessible to them.

Important federal civil rights laws were enacted to combat such forms of discrimination and protect the fundamental right to vote for all Americans. The link below provides guidance to states, local jurisdictions, election officials, poll workers, and voters on how the Americans with Disabilities Act and other federal laws help ensure fairness in the voting process for people with disabilities.

DON'T GET DIS--CONNECTED! ENERGY ASSISTANCE CAN HELP

Know someone struggling to pay their utility bills?
Know someone worried about getting disconnected at the end of the moratorium?



The Milwaukee County Energy assistance program, along with We Energies and the Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance Program (WHEAP) are working together to help Milwaukee County residents avoid getting disconnected this year.

Each spring thousands of Milwaukee County residents are disconnected by utility providers. When the moratorium ends April 15, notices of possible disconnections will begin to go out and will continue throughout the summer.

Milwaukee County residents that have been making payments on their We Energies heating bill, but are still behind have a chance to avoid disconnection this year.

Who Qualifies?

To qualify for this program, you need to meet the following requirements:

- Be a We Energies customer for your home heating.
- Live in Milwaukee County.
- Apply for and qualify for the Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance Program (WHEAP).





myRA AND my SOCIAL SECURITY CAN HELP SECURE YOUR RETIREMENT

Achieving financial security is an important part of enjoying a satisfying retirement. Social Security has many tools to help you plan for your future.

A great first step is to visit www.socialsecurity.gov/myaccount. With a *my Social Security* account, you'll get immediate access to your personal *Social Security Statement*, your earnings record, and an estimate of your retirement benefits at age 62, at your full retirement age, and at age 70. You can also verify your earnings are correct, since we base your future benefits on your earnings record.

When you open a *my Social Security* account, we protect your information by using strict identity verification and security features. The application process has built-in features to detect fraud and confirm your identity. Your personal *my Social Security* account can help you figure out how much more you might want to save for your future, but it can do a whole lot more. For example, in the District of Columbia and several states, you can request a replacement Social Security card online — find out if you can at www.socialsecurity.gov/ssnumber.

In addition to using your personal *my Social Security* account, you can prepare for a secure, comfortable retirement by visiting www.myra.gov. There, you'll find *myRA*, a new retirement savings option from the Department of the Treasury for the millions of Americans who face barriers to saving for retirement. *myRA* is a simple and secure way to help you take control of your future.

myRA makes it easy and affordable to start saving for retirement, even if you can save only a little bit right now. It's designed for people who don't have a retirement savings plan through work, or lack other options for saving. If you already have access to a retirement savings plan, such as a 401(k), learn more about that plan because it might offer matching contributions or other benefits.

myRA helps workers grow their money faster than they can with most traditional savings accounts, and there's

no risk. Since it's not tied to a particular employer, workers can hold on to their *myRA* account when they move from one job to another.

With your personal *my Social Security* and *myRA* accounts in place, you too can prepare to reap the joys of a financially secure retirement. Learn more about all of your choices at www.socialsecurity.gov.

EX-SPOUSE BENEFITS, TAXES, AND YOU

Mid-April features both Ex-Spouse Day and tax day. These two observances are extra important if you are an ex-spouse, because Social Security pays benefits to eligible former spouses. And, you may need to claim this income on your tax forms.

If you are age 62, unmarried, and divorced from someone entitled to Social Security retirement or disability benefits, you may be eligible to receive benefits based on his or her record. To be eligible, you must have been married to your ex-spouse for 10 years or more. If you have since remarried, you can't collect benefits on your former spouse's record unless your later marriage ended by annulment, divorce, or death. Also, if you're entitled to benefits on your own record, your benefit amount must be less than you would receive based on your ex-spouse's work. In other words, we'll pay the higher of the two benefits for which you're eligible, but not both.


You can apply for benefits on your ex-spouse's record even if he or she hasn't retired, as long as you divorced at least two years before applying. The same rules apply for a deceased former spouse.

The amount of benefits you get has no effect on the benefits of your ex-spouse and his or her current spouse. Visit *Retirement Planner: If You Are Divorced* at www.socialsecurity.gov/retire2/divspouse.htm to find all the eligibility requirements you must meet to apply as a divorced spouse. Our benefits planner gives you an idea of your monthly benefit amount. If your ex-spouse died after you divorced, you can still qualify for widow's benefits. You'll find information about that in a note at the bottom of the website.

Visit www.socialsecurity.gov/retire2/divspouse.htm today to learn whether you're eligible for benefits on your ex-spouse's record. That could mean a considerable amount of monthly income. What you learn may bring a smile to your face ... even on tax day!

With the merger of three different programs the 2015-1016 season saw a big change for wheelchair basketball in southeast Wisconsin. In partnership with the Milwaukee Bucks we are proud to say Milwaukee houses the largest club in the nation – the Milwaukee Bucks Wheelchair Basketball Club. Organized by the Wisconsin Adaptive Sports Association (WASA), a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization: the club includes a total of six teams in five divisions, serving 70 athletes, from ages 6 to 60, including children and veterans. The teams also feature currently feature 6 current US and German national team athletes preparing for the Rio de Janeiro, Brazil Paralympic Games 2016 and 4 former Paralympic coaches and athletes.

One of these successful athletes is a reigning Paralympic champion and our new Basketball Club Director: Mareike Miller. Her outstanding performance as top scorer in the London 2012 Paralympic gold medal game led her German national team to the greatest success in our sport. Currently, she competes for our Championship Division White and women's team. This past weekend Mareike Miller and our women's team won the 2016 National Championship in the team's inaugural season. Leading the team in scoring and leadership, our Basketball Club Director was also named MVP of the tournament.

We are very excited to have such a high level athlete to continue growing our club. Mareike also coaches our Junior Bucks Varsity and Women's teams passing on the great experience and knowledge to benefit our club at many levels. This summer, she will return to the Paralympics in Rio de Janeiro to defend the gold medal for Team Germany.

The Milwaukee Bucks Junior Prep and Varsity teams are currently ranked 4th and 6th in the nation. The Milwaukee Bucks Championship Division White team is ranked 2nd. All three teams are heading to Louisville, KY to compete at the National Wheelchair Basketball Association's (NWBA) National Championships April 7-10.

Additionally, the Milwaukee Bucks Wheelchair Basketball Club will be graduating four seniors this year into collegiate wheelchair basketball programs at Alabama and UW Whitewater. Two of these High School Seniors were able to sign over the weekend to become part of the renowned UW-Whitewater Wheelchair Athletics program. Drew Selz (Waterford Union High School) and Joseph Boehmer (Homestead High School) will continue their athletic and scholastic career with their men's team. Both of their athletic achievement and hard work in the classroom did not go unnoticed as the UW-Whitewater head coach and Milwaukee Bucks athlete, Jeremy Lade (3-time Paralympian), had both athletes sign their letter of intent on Saturday.

The Milwaukee Bucks are premium partner of the Wisconsin Adaptive Sports Association in providing the game of basketball for all abilities. It is our hope that through this partnership, WASA and the Milwaukee Bucks Wheelchair Basketball Club will have the opportunity to serve more athletes with physical disabilities throughout Wisconsin.
