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BAT NIGHT RETURNS TO WEHR NATURE CENTER JUNE 10

Bat Night, an evening that brings together the fiction, folklore, and facts about bats, is returning to Wehr Nature Center, **Friday, June 10, from 8-10 p.m.** The Nature Center is located in Whitnall Park, at 9701 W. College Ave.



Designed for adults, the program explores the fears and misconceptions surrounding bats, identification of common neighborhood bats, the value of bats in controlling insect populations and as pollinators, and the use of technology to learn more about them.

Wehr naturalist Howard Aprill will lead the interactive program that includes information on the race to save North American bats from potential extinction from white-nose syndrome. Earlier this month, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources reported that the disease has spread to new bat hibernating sites in Wisconsin and is starting to decimate bat populations here.

After the indoor introduction, participants will join Aprill in using the latest technology to search for the five species of bats in Whitnall Park. Aprill will demonstrate the specialized detectors that combine a system for recording bat calls and a global positioning system (GPS). The recordings show different sound-wave patterns for different species of bats, and the GPS pinpoints a bat's location. Through the technology, participants will "hear" the ultrasonic echolocations produced by bats. Participants will also learn how they can protect bats by getting involved in citizen-science monitoring.

Admission for Milwaukee County Residents is \$7 per person; Non-Milwaukee County Residents, \$10 per person; and Members of Friends of Wehr, \$5 per person. Parking is \$3 per car.



Strategies for Communicating with Individuals Living with Dementia

SOCIAL SECURITY SUPPORTS NATIONAL CANCER SURVIVORS DAY

In 2016, more than a million people will be diagnosed with cancer around the world. This alarming statistic affects people and families everywhere. On June 5, 2016, we observe National Cancer Survivors Day in the United States. In support of this day, Social Security encourages getting checkups to provide early detection, raise awareness through education, and recognize the survivors who have gone through this battle or are still living with the disease.

Social Security stands strong in our support of the fight against cancer. We offer services to patients dealing with this disease through our disability program and our Compassionate Allowances program. Compassionate Allowances are cases with medical conditions so severe they obviously meet Social Security's disability standards, allowing us to process the cases quickly with minimal medical information. Many cancers are on our Compassionate Allowance list.

There's no special application or form you need to submit for Compassionate Allowances. Simply apply for disability benefits using the standard Social Security or Supplemental Security Income (SSI) application. Once we identify you as having a Compassionate Allowances condition, we'll expedite your disability application.

Social Security establishes new Compassionate Allowances conditions using information received at public outreach hearings, from the Social Security and Disability Determination Services communities, from medical and scientific experts, and from data based on our research. For more information about Compassionate Allowances, including the list of eligible conditions, visit www.socialsecurity.gov/compassionateallowances.

If you think you qualify for disability benefits based on a Compassionate Allowances condition, please visit www.socialsecurity.gov to apply for benefits.

MEN'S HEALTH AND SOCIAL SECURITY

This year, we observe National Men's Health Week from June 13 to 19. It so happens that Father's Day falls on the last day of Men's Health Week, a perfect time for focusing on health education and awareness, disease prevention, and family.

Social Security encourages you to support fathers and friends everywhere in their efforts to stay healthy. The right balance of diet, exercise, regular visits to doctors and health care

providers, and overall healthy living can go a long way to help everyone remain a part of your daily life for years to come.

Part of staying healthy and happy is reducing the amount of stress in your life. That's where opening a *my Social Security* online account can help. Our online services make doing business with us fast and easy. At *my Social Security*, you can:

- Keep track of your earnings and verify them every year;
- Get an estimate of your future benefits, if you are still working;
- Get a letter with proof of your benefits, if you currently receive them; and
- Manage your benefits:
 - Change your address;
 - Start or change your direct deposit;
 - Request a replacement Medicare card; and
 - Get a replacement SSA-1099 or SSA-1042S for tax season.

In some states, you can even request a replacement Social Security card online using *my Social Security*. Currently available in the District of Columbia, Iowa, Kentucky, Michigan, Nebraska, New Mexico, Pennsylvania, Washington, and Wisconsin, it's an easy, convenient, and secure way to request a replacement card online. We continue to add more states, so we encourage you to check www.socialsecurity.gov/ssnumber to see where the service is available.

Tell dad to check out the healthy amount of features we have to offer at www.socialsecurity.gov/myaccount.

In addition to using *my Social Security*, there are a number of other things you can do online with Social Security. For example, you can use the *Retirement Estimator* to plug in different numbers, retirement dates, and scenarios to help you decide the best time for you to retire. It's available at www.socialsecurity.gov/estimator.



In most cases, once you submit your electronic application, that's it, you're done—no papers to sign or documents to submit.

SUMMER VACATIONS FOR CAREGIVERS:

Some Helpful Tips from Interfaith's Family Caregiver Support Network

Caring for a disabled or aging loved one can make a summer vacation, or even just a weekend getaway seem impossible. Questions run through your mind: Who will make sure Dad takes his medicine? Who will remind Mom to use her walker? What if there's a power failure or a sudden illness? Thinking about all the things that need to be done, and all the things that might happen while you're gone can be so overwhelming that you feel like it's easier not to try.

However, the first rule of successful caregiving is that you must take care of yourself too. To avoid caregiver burnout and compromising your own health, taking breaks from caregiving responsibilities is essential. And, having a plan in place really helps. If you begin organizing now and lining up the assistance you will need, a much-needed vacation could still be part of your summer plans this year. Here are a few tips to help you get started:

- 1) Enlist Friends and Family as In-home Caregivers: Identify the family member, trusted friends or neighbors who would be able to fill in for you. Then get these people involved in your plans as soon as possible. The more time they have to arrange their own schedules and coordinate with you and each other, the better.
- 2) Find In-home Caregiving Services: If needed, FCSN can help you find paid in-home care assistance. Depending on individual needs, paid caregivers can help with a wide variety of activities of daily living. If you're planning to use this kind of service, begin establishing that relationship right away. You want to give your loved one time to become familiar and be certain that the caregiver is a good match. In addition, there are programs available through FCSN that may help pay for these services. Call us at 414/220-8600 to determine if you qualify.
- 3) Respite Care: Many retirement communities, assisted living and long term care facilities offer 24 hour respite care on a per diem basis for short stays. There are also daytime-only activities and supervision available through a variety of adult day

centers in the area. FCSN is has a comprehensive list as well as additional information about many of these providers.

- 4) Organize Important Documents: Prepare a folder or binder of information for the people and/or agencies providing care while you are away. Include emergency contacts, physicians, preferred hospital, pharmacy, and other service providers, such as therapy, meal delivery, home care, etc. Be sure to list all your loved one's medications and include other important documents such as Power of Attorney, Living Will, Advance Directives and Do Not Resuscitate orders. Once again, if you would like assistance with this process, call FCSN at 414/220-8600 to speak with a Resource Specialist and to request one of our "Caregiver Toolbox" information organizers.

Being a caregiver is hard work year round. As we enter the warm weather vacation season, FCSN wants to encourage you to take care of yourself too so that you can continue to care for your loved one. The good news is that we are here to help. You don't have to do it alone.
