

How To: Find My County Supervisor Using the Interactive Map

The Milwaukee County Land Information Office's (MCLIO) Interactive Map can be used to find many different types of data that are relevant to where you live. For example, one commonly asked question is "who is my county supervisor?" Follow the instructions below to answer this question and more.

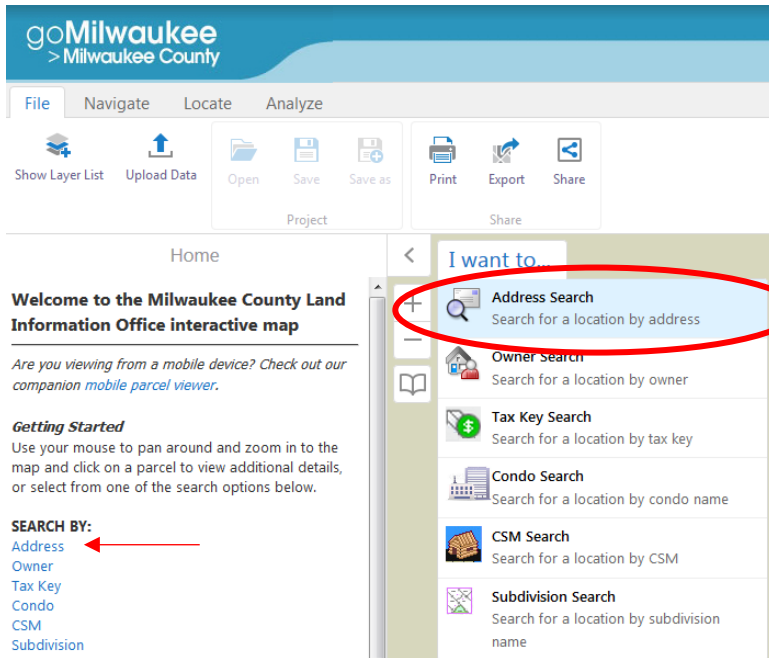
Step One

Go the MCLIO webpage: <http://county.milwaukee.gov/mclio> and click on the Milwaukee County Interactive Map image at bottom right.

Step Two

Wait for the map to load. Click the "I want to.." menu and Address Search or alternatively, click the Address link in the left Home panel.



Step Three

Start typing your address and let the dropdown box auto-fill. Click the result that matches the address of interest and Search. The map will zoom to the location and the result will appear in the left panel.

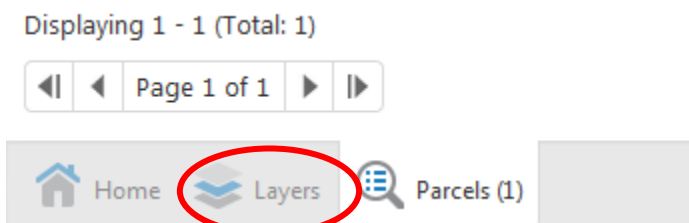
Enter the house / unit number and street name. As you type a list of values will be filtered to help you find the address. (Example: 901 N 9TH ST).

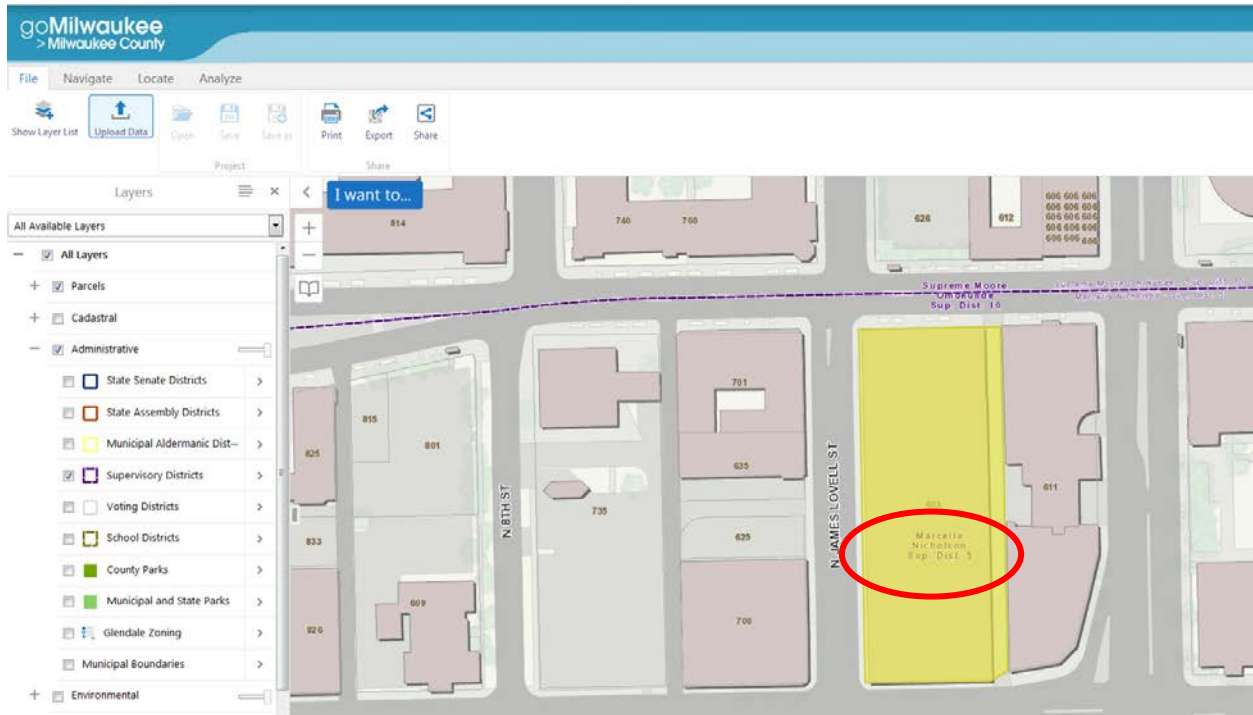
Step Four

At the bottom of the left panel, click the Layers tab.



Step Five

Maximize the Administrative Data section and click the check box to turn it on. Click the checkbox next to “Supervisory Districts” to turn it on. You will now see which Supervisor’s district your address lies within.



Step Six (optional)

In this case, the address is right on the edge of two districts but within District 5 (Supervisor Nicholson). By turning on other layers, you can also see your city alderman, voting, school, and other districts. If it is not clear by the label, you can always right click and select “What’s Here?” to be certain. The result will appear in the left panel.
