Cool Waters & David F. Schulz Aquatic Centers

Prior to opening for the summer, Milwaukee County Parks will offer "Early Bird" discounts of 10% on season passes, May 20–23, from 8:30 a.m.–4 p.m. The discount will continue to be available during open pool hours May 24–June 1.

Cool Waters Family Aquatic Park in Greenfield Park, 2028 S. 124 St., and David F. Schulz Aquatic Center in Lincoln Park, 1301 E. Hampton Ave., will open for the official summer swimming season, Sat., May 24. Hours at Cool Waters are Mon.—Thurs., 10 a.m.—8 p.m; and Fri., Sat., Sun. and Holidays, 10 a.m.—6 p.m. Hours at Lincoln Park include a special swim session for children age 7 and under and their adult caregivers. The "Tot Time" is Mon.—Fri., 10 a.m—noon. Birding in Lincoln Park

Three expert birders will lead a bird hike through Lincoln Park, Sat., May 24, from 8-9:30 a.m. Participants should meet at the Blatz Pavilion at 1301 W. Hampton Ave. Participants will discover how recent cleanup and restoration efforts have affected which migratory birds come to visit. Leading the hikes will be Charles Hanger, editor of BirdWatching Magaine; Marilyn Bontly, of the Schlitz Audubon Bird Club; and Carl Schwartz, of the Wisconsin Society for Ornithology and Bird City Wisconsin. All levels of birders are welcomed—no prior expertise is needed. Participants are asked to bring binoculars.
