
This report was updated on May 08, 2020 and includes data through May 07, 2020.


Cumulative cases


Milwaukee Co. cumulative cases identifying as Black or AA


Cases per day

Milwaukee Co. daily number of cases identifying as Black or AA






Milwaukee Co. daily number of cases identifying as Black or AA


Average daily incidence

Milwaukee Co. average daily incidence identifying as Black or AA




