

PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE

In accordance with 24 CFR 91.105 and as the lead agency for the Milwaukee Urban County Jurisdiction and the Milwaukee County HOME Consortium, Milwaukee County is holding a public hearing for input in the 2025 Annual Plan and the Five Year Consolidated Plan outlining the use of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funds received from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development. For Fiscal Year 2025, Milwaukee County estimates HUD funding to total \$2.8 million.

The County is also amending its 2020-2024 Consolidate Plan and 2022 Annual Action Plan to include the receipt of Emergency Solution Grant (ESG) funding. The County received this funding in 2022 and again 2024.

This public hearing will include hearing oral presentations from all potential grant Sub-recipients who have timely submitted their grant proposals and are eligible grant applicants seeking to receive CDBG funds for the 2025 grant cycle. The Committee on Community, Environment and Economic Development is holding a public hearing on Monday, September 16, 2024 at 9:30 a.m. which will be a hybrid meeting live streamed on the County Legislative Information Center <https://milwaukeecounty.legistar.com/Calendar.aspx> as well as in person in Room 203-R at the Milwaukee County Courthouse located at 901 N. 9th Street. Non-profit agencies are eligible to apply for these grants.
