On Friday, June 13, 2025, I stood with community members, County leaders, and my family to proudly celebrate the grand opening of the new Marcia P. Coggs Health & Human Services Center—a state-of-the-art, \$42 million facility that marks a major investment in community care and equitable access to services.

Located at 1230 W. Cherry Street, the new four-story, modern facility stands as a symbol of Milwaukee County's commitment to meeting the growing needs of its residents with compassion, dignity, and efficiency.

The Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Milwaukee County's largest department, provides a wide range of critical services, including disability, housing, and

veterans' support. It also encompasses the former Behavioral Health Division and oversees the Aging and Disability Resource Center, Child Support Services, and juvenile justice facilities.

Originally named in 2003 for the trailblazing Marcia P. Coggs, the first Black woman elected to the Wisconsin State Assembly, the new building reflects her enduring legacy of advocacy and public service. Her lifelong fight for social change and equitable access to human services laid the foundation for what we celebrate today.

This new center is not only a building, it's a beacon of hope, equity, and progress, carrying forward a legacy that continues to uplift and empower generations.

Milwaukee County Transit System (MCTS) Changes in 2025

I'm honored to serve on the Transportation & Transit Committee and remain dedicated to representing District 13 voices on all transportation-related issues.



During recent County Board hearings, I emphasized the importance of including those most affected in the decision-making process, because if you really want true, positive results, you have to bring the folks who are impacted firsthand to the table and into the conversation to come up with solutions.

This year, the Milwaukee County Transit System (MCTS) has faced real challenges, from budget shortfalls to communication gaps; real changes had to be made. Now, they're turning the page with new leadership, President and CEO Steve Fuentes. He has committed to strengthening relationships with union leadership and transit operators to ensure that the solutions implemented are both equitable and effective. I'm hopeful this marks a turning point toward a more reliable, equitable, and sustainable transit system for all of us.

MCTS Fall 2025 Service Changes

Milwaukee County Transit System (MCTS) has implemented major route adjustments to improve reliability as part of MOVE 2025. These changes will affect dozens of routes. Highlights include:

- **More Frequent Service:** Routes 57, 63, and the BlueLine.
- **New Routes:** 59 (Drexel Ave.), 73 (Mill Rd.), 74 (S. 43rd St.–Miller Park Way), and 82 (S. 13th–Howell Ave.).
- **Extensions & Connections:** Routes 14, 30, 52, 56, and 68.
- **Modifications:** Routes 19, 20, 28, 51, 55, 58, BlueLine, RedLine, and PurpleLine.

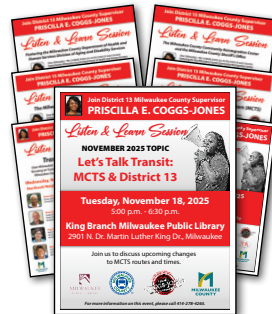
What This Means for District 13

The expanded service under MOVE 2025 will benefit many riders in District 13. We are thoughtfully addressing fare evasion concerns to ensure that solutions do not negatively impact those who rely most heavily on public transit. My office will continue to advocate for transparency, accountability, and community-driven planning as we move into a difficult budget season for MCTS.

Legislative Work

This year I authored or co-sponsored several resolutions including:

- **25-117** – Supporting the "We Can Save Lives Tour" suicide-prevention training.
- **25-119** – Reconstituting the City-County Task Force on Climate and Economic Equity.
- **25-221** – Recognizing February 18 as Vel Phillips Day in Milwaukee County.
- **25-295** – Affirming the County's commitment to justice, safety, and access at the Courthouse Complex.
- **25-358** – Urging the State to raise the purchase age for tobacco and related products to 21.
- **25-376** – Supporting the CityWise rental-housing information initiative.
- **25-588** – Authorizing Milwaukee County to apply for and implement a \$250,000 Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation grant for the new Building Bridges Small Business Grant Program, which helps local entrepreneurs acquire and expand their real estate footprint. This initiative is already supporting small business growth in Milwaukee County, including two recipients located in District 13. (Congratulations, Allah Mode and Honey Bee Sage Wellness!)
