Supervisor Coggs-Jones to Host Ceremonial Swearing-in for Friends and Family on Friday

MILWAUKEE – Newly-elected County Supervisor Priscilla E. Coggs-Jones will host a ceremonial gathering for close friends and family on Friday, April 23 at 11 a.m. in the County Board room of the Milwaukee County Courthouse.

Coggs-Jones was officially sworn-in at the Milwaukee County Clerk's office on Monday. Friday's event is an opportunity for close family members and the media to observe her taking the oath of office in a formal setting.

Wisconsin Court of Appeals Judge Maxine Aldridge White, the highest-ranking African American woman judge in the state, and former Chief Judge of the First District, will perform the oath of office.

Supervisor Coggs-Jones is the granddaughter of Isaac Newton Coggs, the first African American elected to the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors, and the daughter of Elizabeth Coggs-Jones, who served as County Supervisor for the 10th District for nearly 23 years.

Media should enter the Courthouse from the 10th Street entrance and be prepared for a brief Covid-19 screening.
