

Dear Constituent,

2012 has brought many changes to the 16th District and to Milwaukee County as a whole. With redistricting at the end of 2011, the County Board of Supervisors has been reduced to 18, bringing the size of the district to approximately 54,000 citizens.

As your representative, I have been working to improve our district through many initiatives involving the county parks, transit, and public safety as well the less visible parts of county government such as delivery of social services and mental health services.

Many of the challenges facing Milwaukee County are not new and continue to plague local units of government across the state of Wisconsin. We continue to struggle with the ever-increasing cost of health care and the need to fund public safety.

Moving forward, I will continue to look for innovative ways to develop solutions that work for our community, taking into consideration the impact on property taxes and the amount of services provided. Transit, parks and public safety will always be high priorities along with efficient delivery of services throughout Milwaukee County and the 16th district.

This fall, I will host three town hall meetings to discuss the **2013 budget** in greater detail and other significant issues facing Milwaukee County and the district.
