**Dear Neighbors,**

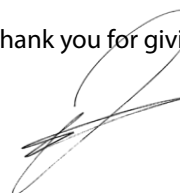
To say that 2025 has been a challenging year is an understatement. Federal funds have dried up or been clawed back, local living costs continue to rise, and Milwaukee County has conducted much-needed audits of our county jail and transportation system. Yet, as we've navigated these difficult decisions, I've remained steadfastly focused on doing what I can to improve the quality of life for every resident of District 4 and Milwaukee County.

During my second year in office, I worked diligently to increase access to affordable housing – both subsidized and naturally occurring. As in my first year, I've continued to help build coalitions that fight for resources and policies to keep people in their homes or help them get off the street and into shelter as quickly as possible.

A highlight of my year has been the privilege of overseeing the revitalization of two playgrounds (Mitchell Airport Park and South Shore Park) and South Shore Beach, helping re-found two Friends of the Parks groups in Holler Park and Tippecanoe Park, and keeping every wading pool in District 4 open for the second year in a row (Humboldt, Saveland, and Tippecanoe).

Throughout my first term, whether it's been successfully launching the first county-wide affordable housing marketplace in Wisconsin history, securing funding to revamp Wilson Senior Center's heating and cooling system, or ensuring our families can enjoy revitalized county parks, I have tried to live out my commitment to leave Milwaukee County and District 4 a better place to live and raise a family. ### South Shore Beach and Playground

I joined Milwaukee County Parks and Alderwoman Dimitrijevic in celebrating the grand opening of the brand-new South Shore Park Playground with a ribbon cutting on July 18, 2025. The new playground and beach represent a generational revitalization of South Shore Park. Both the beach and the playground enhance the accessibility of South Shore for kids of all abilities and were informed by extensive community input – thanks in part to a strong partnership with Friends of South Shore Park. The new beach is cleaner, safer, and returns South Shore Beach's status as a crown jewel of Milwaukee County. Construction of the new beach and playground at South Shore were both completed in record time, making 2025 one of the most transformative years in South Shore Park's history.

### New Beach at South Shore Park

This transformation didn't happen overnight. It's the result of years of dedicated environmental restoration work, driven by a shared vision to make our shoreline more accessible, sustainable, and welcoming for generations to come. The upgraded trails, improved water access, and renewed focus on ecological stewardship reflect what we can accomplish when public agencies and community partners come together with purpose.

As your County Supervisor, I'm proud to support projects like this that enhance our quality of life and strengthen our connection to the environment. South Shore Park is more than just a destination – it's a symbol of what we value as a community: collaboration, resilience, and a deep respect for the natural spaces that surround us.

### Airport Park

County Executive David Crowley, Alderman Scott Spiker, former Supervisor Jason Haas, and I opened the brand-new playground at Mitchell Airport Park, marking a major milestone for the Airport Gardens neighborhood. The new playground replaces the oldest play structure in the Milwaukee County Parks System. Installed in 1995, the aging equipment had long needed replacement. I made completing the playground a top priority. Within my first month in office, I worked closely with county officials to finalize the playground design. Construction began in October 2024, and on May 9, 2025, the playground officially opened to the public.
