MILWAUKEE – Today begins the observation of [Hispanic Heritage Month](#), which celebrates the accomplishments and contributions of Hispanic Americans who have achieved success and inspired others.

“As the first Afro-Latina elected Chairwoman of the County Board it is my great pleasure to celebrate Hispanic Heritage Month in Milwaukee County,” said Chairwoman Marcelia Nicholson. “Uplifting Milwaukee County’s Hispanic community is vital to our vision of achieving racial equity. Hispanic Heritage Month began as Hispanic Heritage Week after President Lyndon B. Johnson signed a bill establishing the week of September 15 as such in 1968. The weeklong observation was extended to its current full 30-day period of September 15 through October 15 in 1988.
